There is hereby appropriated Five Million Five Hundred Twenty-Two Thousand Five Hundred Forty-Seven Dollars (\$5,522,547) of which to include Three Hundred Thirty-Eight Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$338,750) which shall be transferred from the Hospital Construction Fund to the General Fund, Three Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$375,000) which is a contribution from the United States Navy for its share, Six Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$675,000) from the Rehabilitation Fund and Four Million One Hundred Forty-One Thousand Nine Hundred Ten Dollars (\$4,141,910) from Federal matching funds made available to the Department of Public Works, for the construction of Agana Sewage Treatment Plant Project.

Section 7. Effective July 1, 1975, the sum of Three Hundred Thirty-Eight Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (100) is hereby transferred from the General Fund of the government of Guam to the Hospital Construction Fund, created by Section 37, Part One of Public Law 12-60.

Section 8. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Executive Branch of the government of Guam shall not enter into a federally-financed program without obtaining prior approval, by resolution, of the Legislative Branch of the government.

Section 9. The provisions set forth in Section 8 of this Act shall only apply to agreements entered into on or after the effective date of this Act.

Section 10. The following items of Section 9, Part One of Public Law 12-150 are hereby amended to read as follows:

- "I. Office of the Territorial Auditor
 - For Personal Services, not to exceed the total of Ninety-Seven Thousand One Hundred Four Dollars (\$97,104) for the positions enumerated in the schedule of Section 10 of this Act.
 - 2. For Personnel Benefits, not to exceed the total of Nine Thousand Six Hundred Seventy-Two Dollars (\$9,672) as follows:
 For contribution to the Retirement
 Fund, not to exceed

 For health and hospital insurance,

not to exceed \$ 674

For life insurance, not to exceed \$ 90

4. For Contractual Services, not to exceed the total of Twenty-Nine Thousand Eight Hundred Dollars (\$29,800) as follows:

For office space rental, including needed utilities and maintenance

costs, not to exceed \$ 18,500

For rental and servicing of office machines, not to exceed

\$ 2,500

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For repairs of equipments, not to exceed For office construction, not to exceed 2,500 For telephone installation and 1,950 service, not to exceed For postage and printing, not to 1,500 exceed For housing allowance, not to exceed 2,400 250" For advertisement, not to exceed

Section 11. Public Law 9-68 of the Ninth Guam Legislature is hereby repealed in its entirety.

Section 12. The sum of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) is hereby appropriated from any available balance in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund of the government of Guam for the operational expenses of the Health Commission established by Section 9990.2 of the Government Code of Guam. The appropriation herein made shall include, but not limited to, paying the costs of implementing the provisions of Section 4 of Public Law 12-187 and for a feasibility study for the establishment of an information system capable of collecting and analyzing fiscal and program data from various health care providers relating to cost, utilization review, provider profiles, quality of care, and consumer satisfaction.

Section 13. The sum of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) is hereby appropriated from any available balance in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund of the government of Guam for the refurbishing and refurnishing of the Government House, renovation of the office of the Governor, and for such other purposes as the Governor deems necessary to fulfill his responsibilities as Chief Executive. The Governor shall quarterly

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report to the Speaker of the Legislature the status of the appropriation herein made to include, but not limited to, the purposes and amounts expended thereunder.

Section 14. The sum of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000) is hereby transferred from the Hospital Construction Fund to the General Fund to satisfy the appropriations made in Sections 12 and 13 of this Act.

Section 15. There is hereby appropriated from any available balance in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) to the Office of Guam's Delegate to the United States House of Representatives.
