AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 9660.14 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO PROVIDE THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS SHALL OPERATE AND MAINTAIN NO LESS THAN THREE LAND-FILL PUBLIC DUMPS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. Section 9660.14 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 9660.14. Operation of dumps. Public dumps shall be established, operated and maintained by the Department of Public Works, except where the Governor by Executive Order, places this responsibility upon a Commissioner. However, the Department of Public Works shall, in addition to the existing Ordot land-fill public dump, establish, operate and maintain a land-fill public dump in the northern and in the southern regions of the island. Said dumps shall be located on government land. Sites shall be chosen with due consideration to insure that quality of surrounding ground and surface waters shall not be impaired. The best available management techniques shall be utilized in the planning and management of all public dumps including daily covering of waste to minimize insect problems; and appropriate measures to prevent fire and consequential air pollution. The Department of Public Works is encouraged to utilize the services of the Bureau of Solid Waste Management, Department of Health, Education and Welfare and other federal programs of technical and financial assistance."

Section 2. There is hereby authorized to be appropriated

the sum of One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000) for
the establishment of the dumps mentioned in Section 1. The
Director of Public Works shall submit under his operational
budget a request for the appropriation of such additional sums
as may be necessary to further implement and manage the sanitary
land-fill dump program as expanded by this Act.

Section 3. A new Section 17607 is hereby added to the Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

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"Section 17607. No additional land may be established as a 'rural zone' and no land presently zoned 'A' may be rezoned without the Commission first having considered an agricultural impact statement which shall be submitted by the Director of the Department of Agriculture. This statement shall provide a detailed statement of:

- a) The agricultural impact of the proposed rezoning upon the agricultural components of the Guam master plan.
- b) Any adverse conservation or agricultural effects which cannot be avoided should the rezoning be approved.
- c) The director's opinion whether said rezoning should be approved and reasons therefor."
