



CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR



AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 9660.14 OF THE
GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO PROVIDE THAT
THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS SHALL
OPERATE AND MAINTAIN NO LESS THAN THREE
LAND-FILL PUBLIC DUMPS.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 9660.14 of the Government Code of Guam
3 is hereby amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 9660.14. Operation of dumps. Public dumps
5 shall be established, operated and maintained by the
6 Department of Public Works, except where the Governor by
7 Executive Order, places this responsibility upon a
8 Commissioner. However, the Department of Public Works shall,
9 in addition to the existing Ordot land-fill public dump,
10 establish, operate and maintain a land-fill public dump in
11 the northern and in the southern regions of the island.
12 Said dumps shall be located on government land. Sites shall
13 be chosen with due consideration to insure that quality
14 of surrounding ground and surface waters shall not be
15 impaired. The best available management techniques shall
16 be utilized in the planning and management of all public
17 dumps including daily covering of waste to minimize insect
18 problems; and appropriate measures to prevent fire and
19 consequential air pollution. The Department of Public
20 Works is encouraged to utilize the services of the Bureau
21 of Solid Waste Management, Department of Health, Education
22 and Welfare and other federal programs of technical and
23 financial assistance."

24 Section 2. There is hereby authorized to be appropriated

1 the sum of One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000) for
2 the establishment of the dumps mentioned in Section 1. The
3 Director of Public Works shall submit under his operational
4 budget a request for the appropriation of such additional sums
5 as may be necessary to further implement and manage the sanitary
6 land-fill dump program as expanded by this Act.

7 Section 3. A new Section 17607 is hereby added to the
8 Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

9 "Section 17607. No additional land may be established
10 as a 'rural zone' and no land presently zoned 'A' may be
11 rezoned without the Commission first having considered
12 an agricultural impact statement which shall be submitted
13 by the Director of the Department of Agriculture. This
14 statement shall provide a detailed statement of:

- 15 a) The agricultural impact of the proposed rezoning
16 upon the agricultural components of the Guam master
17 plan.
- 18 b) Any adverse conservation or agricultural effects
19 which cannot be avoided should the rezoning be
20 approved.
- 21 c) The director's opinion whether said rezoning should
22 be approved and reasons therefor."
