AN ACT TO REPEAL CHAPTER VIII OF TITLE II OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM AND

TO ENACT A NEW CHAPTER VIII RELATIVE

TO THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A YOUTH CONGRESS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Chapter VIII of Title II of the Government Code of Guam is hereby repealed.

Section 2. A new Chapter VIII is hereby added to Title II of the Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

"CHAPTER VIII -YOUTH CONGRESS

Section 1700. Youth Congress. There is within the Legislative branch of the government of Guam, a Youth Congress.

Section 1701. Functions. The Youth Congress shall act as a legislative body with the power to make its own rules, establish committees, hold hearings, pass resolutions, and to prepare and pass bills, which will be forwarded to the Rules Committee of the Guam Legislature for action as with a legislative bill.

The Youth Congress will represent the Youth of Guam, their desires and aspirations, and will serve as a training and action area for Guam's future leaders.

Section 1702. Membership. The Congress shall be composed of not to exceed fifty-one (51) members, to be known as Representatives, to be elected from the areas listed below:

- 1. Village Representation.
- · a. One (1) representative from each organized

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village with a population below 5,000.

- b. Two (2) representatives from each village with a population between 5,000 and 10,000.
- C. Three (3) representatives from each village over 10,000 population.
- 2. School Representation.
 - a. One (1) representative from each private and public junior high school.
 - b. One (1) representative from each private and public senior high school with a student body below 1,000.
 - c. Two (2) representatives from each private and and public senior high school with a student body above 1,000.
 - d. Three (3) representatives from the University of Guam.

Section 1703. Eligibility of Representatives and Electorate. No person shall be eligible to vote for a Representative, or sit in the Congress who has not attained the age of fourteen (14) years, who will be twenty-five (25) prior to the expiration of the term for which he seeks to qualify as a voter or as a member, or who has been convicted of a felony or crime involving moral turpitude and has not received a pardon restoring his civil rights.

Section 1704. Vacancies. Vacancies occurring in the Congress shall be filled as the Congress shall provide, except that no person filling a vacancy shall hold office longer than for the remainder of the term for which his predecessor was elected.

Section 1705. Sessions. Regular sessions of the Congress shall be held each third Saturday of the year

exclusive of holidays, commencing the third Saturday in October, and shall continue for one (1) calendar year.

Sessions shall be held in the legislative chamber of the Guam Legislature.

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Section 1706. Elections. General election to the Youth Congress shall be held on the third Monday in September, commencing September, 1975 and each year thereafter. The election for school representatives will be conducted by the school principal of the public or private junior or senior high schools and by the President of the University of Guam at the school which the eligible electorate attend, and at which the electorate are officially enrolled, and each voter shall be entitled to vote by private ballot for the number of candidates allotted their school as is provided in Section 1702 of this Code. The election for village representatives will be conducted by the village commissioner for the eligible electorate residing within the village boundaries, and each voter shall be entitled to vote for the number of candidates allotted his village as is provided in Section 1702 of this Code. The eligible electorate may vote in both the school and village elections.

Candidates for election may run as members of a political party or as independents, all such candidates to have received by petition from the eligible youth electorate at least 50 signatures. Names of candidates on ballots shall appear as is provided in Section 2254 of this Code.

It shall be the responsibility of the school principal, the President of the University of Guam or the village commissioner to provide forms for petitions, ballots and tally sheets, the necessary ballot boxes, and personnel to supervise the election, count and tally the ballots.

Results of the election will be certified by the commissioner, school principal or the President of the University of Guam as appropriate within 3 days after the election to the Secretary of the Guam Legislature, who shall verify the election results, and certify election of members to the Youth Congress.

Any disputes resulting from the election shall be resolved by the Chairman of the Judiciary Committee of the Guam Legislature.

Section 1707. Duties. The Congress shall be the judge of the selection and qualification of its own members, It shall choose from its members its own officers, its rules and procedure, not inconsistent with this Chapter or the Rules of the Guam Legislature. The quorum of the Congress shall equal one-half of its elective membership plus one.

No bill shall be considered passed unless a majority of its members present and voting indicate by an affirmative vote their desire to do pass.

Section 1708. Operations. The Congress is authorized to employ on a part-time basis under contract a basic staff consisting of an Administrative Officer, a legal secretary, attaches including a Legal Counsel, a recording secretary, and a sergeant-at-arms. Additional logistic support, clerical and technical assistance, will be provided by the Guam Legislature and the legislative staff.

Section 1709. Compensation. Representatives of Congress shall be compensated at the rate of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for each regularly weekly meeting they attend."

Section 3. There is hereby authorized to be appropriated from any available funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund, such amounts as may be necessary to compensate Congress Representatives, as is provided in Section 1709 of the Government Code of Guam, and the contractual service contracts in Section 1708 of the same Code.
