



Introduced by A. L. Cristobal

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE AN APPROPRIATION  
FOR AN ARCHITECTURAL AND ENGINEERING  
DESIGN-PHASE STUDY OF A GYMNASIUM-  
RECREATION CENTER TO BE CONSTRUCTED  
AT GUAM VOCATIONAL-TECHNICAL HIGH  
SCHOOL IN MANGILAO, GUAM.

1 WHEREAS, Guam Vocational-Technical High School has for  
2 almost two decades provided an indispensable service to Guam by  
3 providing young people with twenty-one different types of skills  
4 badly needed by the people of the communities within the  
5 territory; and

6 WHEREAS, during these years, and despite the fact that  
7 between 1971 and 1974 the student body population at Guam Voc-  
8 Tech doubled in size from 450 to 900, the school has never  
9 been provided with gymnasium facilities, it being the only  
10 high school on Guam without them; and

11 WHEREAS, because of the lack of such facilities, courses  
12 in physical education at Guam Voc-Tech are severely limited,  
13 and members of the school's inter-scholastic athletic teams  
14 are compelled to practice at facilities at George Washington  
15 Senior High School and Agueda Johnston Jr. High School at times  
16 when they are not being used by teams from those two schools,  
17 which times often prove most inconvenient to Guam Voc-Tech  
18 students; and

19 WHEREAS, the circumstances mentioned above tend to dis-  
20 courage the participation of Guam Voc-Tech students in physical  
21 education programs, both within the school and in competition  
22 with other schools; and

23 WHEREAS, physical education and competitive sports build  
24 within young people qualities of sportsmanship, teamwork and  
25 physical well-being, and allow students a much-needed outlet  
26 from the rigors of scholastics; and

27 WHEREAS, it is therefore the finding of the 12th Guam  
28 Legislature that the absence of gymnasium facilities at Guam

1 Vocational Technical High School must be remedied; now therefore

2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

3 Section 1. There is hereby authorized to be appropriated  
4 from any available balance in the Unappropriated Surplus of  
5 the General Fund the sum of Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000)  
6 for the purpose of performing an architectural and engineering  
7 design-phase study of the feasibility of constructing a two-  
8 story, steel, Butler-type gymnasium-recreation center at Guam  
9 Vocational-Technical High School in Mangilao, Guam.
