> Introduced by J. H. Underwood F. R. Santos

AN ACT TO ADD CHAPTER II-A TO TITLE XXIV OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM RELATIVE TO SIZE, WEIGHT AND LOAD LIMITATIONS OF OF VEHICLES, AND RESTRICTION OF CERTAIN VEHICLES FROM THE HIGHWAY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. Chapter II-A is hereby added to Title XXIV of the Government Code of Guam, to read as follows:

"Chapter II-A

Size, Weight and Load Limitations, and

Restriction of Certain Vehicles.

Section 23200. Definitions. As used in this Chapter, the following definitions will hold true:

Axle: The common axis of rotation of one or more wheels, whether in one or more segments, and regardless of the number of wheels carried thereon.

Axle Group: An assemblage of two or more consecutive axles considered together in determining their combined load effect on a bridge or pavement structure.

Axle Load: The total load transmitted to the road by all wheels whose centers are included between the two parallel transverse vertical planes forty (40) inches apart, extending across the full width of the vehicle.

Connecting Mechanism: An arrangement of parts inter-connecting two or more consecutive axles to the frame of a vehicle in such a manner as to equalize the load between the axles.

Gross Weight: The weight of a vehicle and/or vehicle combination without word, plus the weight of any

Height: The total vertical dimension of any vehicle above the ground surface including any load and load holding device thereon.

Highway: The entire width between the boundary lines of every publicly maintained surface, when any part thereof is open to the use of the public for purposes of vehicular travel; synonymous and interchangeable in usage with 'street'.

Length: The total longitudinal dimension of any vehicle or combination of vehicles, including any load or load holding devices thereon.

Load: A weight or quantity of anything resting upon a support.

Motor Vehicle: A vehicle which is self-propelled or propelled by electric power obtained from overhead trolley wires, but not operating upon rails.

Owner: A person, other than a lien holder, having the property in or title to a vehicle, including a person entitled to use and possession of a vehicle subject to a security interest in another person, but excluding a lessee under a lease not intended as security.

Scale Tolerance: An allowable variation in the static weight of an axle load in accordance with, but not exceeding, the precision of the scale involved.

26 Semi-Trailer: A vehicle designed for carrying
27 persons or property and drawn by a truck-tractor on which
28 parts of its weight and load rosts.

Single Axle: An assembly of two or more wheels, whose centers are on one transverse vertical plane or may be included between two parallel transverse vertical planes

Single Axle Weight: The total weight transmitted to the road by a single axle.

Special Permit: A written authorization to move or operate on a highway, a vehicle or vehicles with indivisible load of a size and/or weight exceeding the limits prescribed for vehicles in regular operation.

Tandem Axle: Any two or more consecutive axles whose centers are more than forty (40) inches but less than ninety-six (96) inches apart, and are individually attached and/or articulated from a common attachment to the vehicle including a connecting mechanism designed to equalize the load between the axles.

Tandem Axle Weight: The total weight transmitted to the road by two or more consecutive axles whose centers may be included between parallel transverse planes spaced forty (40) inches but less than ninety-six (96) inches apart, extending the full width of the vehicle.

Trailer: A vehicle designed for carrying persons or property and drawn by a motor vehicle which carries no part of the weight and load of the trailer on its own wheels.

Truck: A motor vehicle designed, used or maintained

Truck-Tractor: A motor vehicle designed for drawing other vehicles, but not for a load other than a part of the weight of the vehicle and load drawn.

Vehicle: A device in, upon or by which any person or property may be transported or drawn upon a highway.

Vehicle Combination: A truck-tractor and semi-trailer, either with or without a full trailer, or a truck with one or more full trailers.

Width: The total outside transverse dimension of a vehicle, including any load or load holding devices thereon, but excluding approved safety devices and tire bulge due to load.

Section 23201. Size, Weight and Load Limitations.

(a) It is unlawful for any person to drive or move, or for the owner to cause or knowingly permit to be driven or moved on any highway, any vehicle or vehicles of a size, weight or a load exceeding or otherwise failing to comply with the limitations or requirements stated in this chapter.

(b) The provisions of this chapter governing size, weight and load shall not apply to a vehicle operated under the terms of a special permit issued as herein provided.

Section 23202. Width of Vehicles and Loads. No vehicle, including any load and load holding device thereon shall exceed a total width of one hundred two (102) inches.

Section 23203. Height of Vehicles and Loads. No vehicle, including any load and load holding devices thereon, shall exceed a total height of thirteen (13) feet and six (6) inches.

Section 23204. Length of Vehicles and Loads.

(a) No vehicle, including any load and load holding devices, shall exceed a total length of forty (40) feet
 extreme overall dimension, inclusive of front and rear
 bumpers.

(b) A bus, equipped with three (3) axles, shall not exceed an equal overall length, inclusive of front and rear bumpers, of forty (40) feet.

(c) No combination of two (2) vehicles coupled together, including any load thereon, shall have an overall length, inclusive of front and rear bumpers, in excess of sixty (60) feet, except as otherwise provided in respect to the use of a pole or pipe dolly as authorized in Subsection 23204 (f) of this Chapter.

(d) No other combinations of vehicles shall consist of more than two (2) units, except that one (1) trucktractor semi-trailer may haul one (1) full trailer. No such combinations, including any load, shall exceed an overall length, inclusive of front and rear bumpers of sixty-five (65) feet.

(e) Subject to the foregoing provisions of this Chapter limiting the length of vehicles and loads, the load upon any vehicle operated alone, or the load upon the front vehicle of a combination of vehicles shall not exceed more than three (3) feet beyond the foremost part of that vehicle. The load upon any vehicle operated alone, or the load upon the rear vehicle of a combination of vehicles shall not extend more than six (6) feet beyond the rear of the fixed bed or body of the vehicle, unless that vehicle is followed by an escort vehicle with a rotating yellow beacon, and a sign stating 'Long Load'.

(f) The limitations as to the length of vehicles and loads heretofore stated in Section 23204 shall not apply to any load upon a pole or pipe dolly as defined in Subsection 23001 (y). No poles or pipes or structural

materials or crane which cannot be dismembered, provided, that no pole or pipe or material or crane exceeds eighty (80) feet in length, shall be so transported unless a permit has first been obtained as authorized in Section 23213.

Section 23205. Trailers and Towed Vehicles.

(a) When one (1) vehicle is towing another the drawbar or other connection shall be of sufficient strength to pull all weight towed thereby, and said drawbar or other connection shall not exceed fifteen (15) feet from one vehicle to the other, except the connection between any two (2) vehicles transporting poles, pipes, machinery or other objects of a structural nature which cannot readily be dismembered.

(b) When one (1) vehicle is towing another, and the connection consists of a chain, rope or cable, that connection shall be not less than ten (10) feet, and no more than fifteen (15) feet, and there shall be displayed upon such a connection, a white flag or cloth, not less than twelve (12) inches on an edge. When one (1) vehicle is towing another, their speed shall not exceed twentyfive (25) miles per hour or the posted speed limit, whichever is lower.

Section 23206. Maximum Permissible Load Limit. Vehicle Gross Weight: The total gross weight imposed on the highway surface by a vehicle, or combination of vehicles, shall be determined by the application of Table I:

Section 23207. Performance Requirements.

(a) Brake performance shall conform to the requirements set forth in the most recent Uniform Vehicle Code of the National Committee on Uniform Traffic Laws and Ordinances.

(b) Linkage between any combination of vehicles shall conform to the current recommended practice of the Society of Automotive Engineers.

(c) Vehicles in regular operations shall be permissible only when such loads are transmitted to the highway surface through wheels equipped with pneumatic tires, and no such tire equipment shall be designed for use or used with an operating inflation pressure in excess of one hundred and five (105) pounds per square inch.

(d) Vehicles in regular operation shall be permissible only when on said vehicles, the wheels of the last axle in contact with the highway surface are covered by fendering and/or mud flaps, or a similar device that will deflect any object thrown by the wheels in motion.

(e) Vehicles in regular operation shall have their

identification numbers painted in a contrasting color and at a minimum height of three (3) inches. These numbers shall be in a conspicuous place on the front and rear of that vehicle. The company name will be clearly displayed on the side doors of all vehicles in regular operation. Numbers, license plates and all lights shall be wiped clean before any and all hauls.

(f) No person shall operate on any highway, any vehicle with any load unless said load and covering thereon is securely fastened so as to prevent said load or covering from being loosened, detached or in any manner creating litter or constituting a hazard to other users of the highway.

Section 23208. Authority to Stop, Inspect and Weigh Vehicles; Removal of Excess Loads.

Any police officer observing conditions of (a) vehicle appearance, operation or cargo storage, which might represent a potential or actual hazard, is authorized to stop the driver, and submit the vehicle to an immediate inspection.

(b) Whenever an officer, upon inspection of a vehicle and/or load, determines the existence of a minor 22 infraction, a citation will be issued and the vehicle 23 allowed to proceed to its own shop for correction. A 24 vehicle found to be hazardous to the driver or the public, 25 the officer has the authority to direct the discontinuance 26 of the vehicle passage and require the vehicle to be moved 27 to a storage area or Government facility, and said 28 vehicle shall remain there until such repairs or 29 corrections as stated can be effected either there, or 30 its own shop. Such vehicle will not be allowed back into 31

normal operation until corrections are made.

(c) Any police officer having reason to believe that the weight of a vehicle, either unladen or with load, is unlawful, is authorized to require the driver to stop and submit to a weighing of same by means of portable scales, and should a question of weight arise, the officer will require that such vehicles be driven to the nearest official scales.

(d) Whenever an officer, upon weighing a vehicle and load, as provided above, determines that the weight is unlawful, such officer will require the driver to stop the vehicle in a suitable place and remain standing until such portion of the load is removed as may be necessary to reduce the weight of such vehicle such limit as permitted under this Chapter. A two thousand (2000) pound tolerance over and above the maximum permissible weight will be allowed before the removal of load will be required. All material so unloaded shall be cared for by the owner or driver of such vehicle at the risk of said owner or driver.

(e) Any driver of a vehicle who fails or refused to stop and submit the vehicle, either unladen or with load, to an inspection and/or weighing, or who fails or refuses when directed by the officer upon inspection and/or weighing of the vehicle to stop the vehicle and otherwise comply with the provisions of this Section shall be subject to arrest and fine not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) or be imprisoned for not more than one (1) year, or both.

Section 23209. Restriction of Certain Vehicles.

(a) It is unlawful for any person to drive or move, or the owner to cause or knowingly permit to be driven on any highway, off-road heavy construction equipment, steel

rollers, solid rubber tires, sheepsfoot, tracks, tracks with lugs, tires that incorporate steel mats or chains and/or any other wheel, vehicle or contrivance that the Director of Public Works, or his authorized representative deems harmful or destructive to the highway surface, except for those vehicles that are engaged in actual work on or near the highway.

(b) The provisions of this Section governing restrictions of certain vehicles from the highway shall not apply to any said vehicle or vehicles that are transported by trailer, so long as the total gross weight does not exceed the maximum allowable weight provided in Section 23206.

Section 23210. Liability for Damage to Highways or Structures.

(a) Any person driving or moving any vehicle, object or contrivance, including any person operating or moving a vehicle or combination of vehicles, either legally or under a special permit authorized in Section 23213, shall be liable for all damage any highway or highway structure may sustain as the result of any careless, negligent or illegal driving or moving of said vehicle, combination of vehicles, object or contrivance.

(b) Any person driving or moving any vehicle, object or contrivance, including any person operating or moving a vehicle or combination of vehicles either legally or under a special permit authorized in Section 23213, shall be liable for all damage to structures spanning the highway, or a part of the highway, by reason of vehicles or load heights in excess of that which such structure

will permit, when the clearance height of the vehicle or load or load-holding device thereon is in excess of thirteen (13) feet six (6) inches.

(c) Any person driving or moving any vehicle, object or contrivance, including any person operating or moving a vehicle or combination of vehicles either legally or under a special permit authorized in Section 23213, shall be liable for all damage to structures spanning the highway, or part of the highway, by reason of vehicles or load width in excess of that which such structure will permit and, in any event, where the width of the vehicle or load is in excess of one hundred and two (102) inches.

Any vehicle or combination of vehicles of an 13 (d) unusually large size or weight shall be required to obtain 14 a special hauling permit at least forty-eight (48) hours 15 in advance of the expected moving date. At this time the 16 owner of said vehicle or combination of vehicles will 17 provide proof that arrangements have been made for the 18 removal and replacement of overhead and off-road 19 obstructions, routing, authorized testing of the highway 20 surface, police escort and any other requirements deemed 21 necessary for moving by the Director of Public Works or 22 his authorized representative. All costs shall be borne 23 by the owner. 24

(e) Whenever such driver or mover is not the owner of
any vehicle or combination of vehicles, object or
contrivance, but is so driving or moving same with the
express or implied permission of the owner, then the owner
and driver or mover shall be jointly and severally liable
for any damage.

(f) Any such damage may be recovered in a civil action.

Section 23211. Penalties.

(a) Every person convicted of a violation of any of the provisions of this Chapter for which another penalty is not provided shall, for a first conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not more than Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) and \$0.01/pound over the maximum allowable load as authorized in Section 23206, or by imprisonment for not more than two (2) days, or both such fine and imprisonment; for a second such conviction within one (1) year thereafter, such person shall be punished by a fine of not less than Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) and \$0.01/pound, but not more than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) and \$0.02/pound, or by imprisonment for not more than five (5) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment; upon a third or subsequent conviction within one (1) year after the first conviction such person shall be punished by a fine of not less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) and \$0.02/pound but not more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) and \$0.05/pound, or by imprisonment for not more than seven (7) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

(b) All permit fees and fines shall be deposited in the Territorial Highway Fund

Section 23212. Proceedings to Make Owner Co-Defendant.
In any provision, limitation or requirement of this Chapter of an Employee of the owner of the vehicle concerning
which the violation occurred, employed to operate the
vehicle, the court shall, on the request of such employee,
take appropriate action to make the owner of the vehicle a

co-defendant. In the event it is found that the employee has reasonable grounds to believe that the vehicle or vehicles operated by him as such employee did not violate any provision, limitation or requirement, the court may dismiss the charges against the employee.

Section 23213. Permits for Excess Size and Weight.

(a) A surety bond in a minimum amount of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or proper evidence of adequate insurance, must be filed with the Director of Public Works before a permit will be issued for transporting over-width, overlength or over-weight loads on the highway, except when the applicant is a Territorial or Federal Government Agency.

(b) The Director of Public Works, or his authorized representative, may in his discretion, upon application, in writing good cause being shown therefore, issue a special permit in writing authorizing the applicant to operate or move a vehicle or combination of vehicles of a size or weight exceeding the maximum specified in this Chapter, or otherwise not in conformity with the provisions of this Chapter, upon the highways of Guam. A permit issued under this Section shall not authorize the operation or moving of any vehicle or combination of vehicles without the compliance with Chapter 3 of this Title.

(c) The application for any such permit shall specifically describe the vehicle or combination of vehicles and load to be operated or moved, and the particular highways for which the permit to operate is requested, and whether such permit is requested for a single trip, or for continuous operation for a designated period of time.

(d) The Director of Public Works, or his authorized

representative is authorized to issue or withhold such permit at his discretion, or, if such a permit is issued, to limit the number of trips or to establish time limitations within which the vehicles described may be operated, or to prescribe conditions of operations of such vehicle or vehicles when necessary to assure against undue damage to the highway foundations, surfaces or structures, and may require such undertaking or other security as may be deemed necessary to compensate for any injury to any such highway foundations, surfaces or structure. Each permit shall be valid only for a designated number of consecutive calendar days as specified in the permit, but in no event shall a permit be granted for a period longer than ten (10) days.

(e) At the discretion of the Director of Public Works or his authorized representative, blanket permits will be issued for over-sized vehicles presently on island, and said over-sized vehicles may be subject to time-ofoperations restrictions.

(f) Every such permit shall be carried in the vehicle or combination of vehicles to which it refers, and shall be open to inspection by any police officer. It shall be unlawful for any person to violate any of the terms or conditions of such permits.

(g) A fee of Five Dollars (\$5.00) shall be charge for each permit and no such permit shall be issued until said fee has been paid.

(h) Any vehicle issued with a permanent special equipment license, or requiring a special permit, as required under this Chapter, shall be prohibited from

operating on the highways during the hours of 7:00 to 9:00 a.m., 12:00 to 1:00 p.m., and 4:00 to 6:00 p.m. Mondays through Fridays, except in cases of emergencies, or at the direction of the Director of Public Works.

(i) In the event of disputes over Department of Public Works policy an Appeal Board shall be convened upon written request to the chairman of the Appeal Board. The Board shall consist of three (3) members. One (1) member from the Guam Contractors Association, or a member from the community at large, the Director of Public Safety, or his authorized representative and the Chairman of the Guam Transit Authority, who shall serve as chairman of this Appeal Board. The decision of the Appeal Board shall be binding on all parties.

Section 23214. When the Director of Public Works may Restrict the Use of Highways.

(a) The Director of Public Works, or his authorized representative, may prohibit the operations of certain vehicles upon any highway, or impose restrictions as to the weight of vehicles to be operated upon any highway, whenever any highway, by reason of deterioration, rain or other climatic conditions which will seriously damage the highway unless the use of vehicles thereon is prohibited or the weight thereon is reduced. Such prohibition or restriction shall be effective when notice thereof are erected upon the highway affected and/or effected when notice is given by publication.

(b) Effective Date. This Act shall be effective immediately provided that those provisions of this Act which limits height, width and length as defined in Section 23200 shall not be applicable to vehicles which were duly registered on the date that this Act became law until April 30, 1982. "
