Substitute Bill No. 332

Introduced by Committee on Rules at the request of the Governor

AN ACT TO PERMIT THE GOVERNOR TO ENTER INTO CONTRACTS WITH THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT TO PROVIDE SERVICES TO PERSONS EVACUATED TO GUAM FROM INDOCHINA, AND TO AUTHORIZE EXPENDITURES AND THE REAPPROPRIATION OF REIMBURSEMENT RECEIVED AS A RESULT OF THE PROVIDING OF SUCH SERVICES, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the collapse of South Vietnam appears imminent; and

WHEREAS, reported statements from North Vietnam communists indicate their intention to massacre large numbers of South Vietnamese; and

WHEREAS, the United States has a moral responsibility to prevent the wholesale slaughter of South Vietnamese citizens whose only crime has been to fight for freedom or work for the United States government or American firms; and

WHEREAS, the people of Guam are deeply concerned for the safety and future of the approximately 200,000 South Vietnamese whose lives are in danger; and

WHEREAS, Guam is the closest American Soil to South
Vietnam with facilities which can be made readily available
to act as the first arrival and temporary "safe haven" area for
such an evacuation; and

WHEREAS, the urgency of the situation demands that we proceed immediately with an offer of assistance; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that President Ford and the Congress of the United States be immediately notified through transmission of this Resolution via wire that Guam offers assistance to the United States by acting as an arrival and temporary "safe

haven" area for those South Vietnamese facing death as a 1 result of a communist takeover of South Vietnam; and be it 2 further 3 RESOLVED, that the Speaker certify to and the Legislative Secretary attest the adoption hereof and that copies of the 5 same be thereafter transmitted to the President of the United States, the President Pro Tem of the United States Senate, the 7 Speaker of the House of Representatives, to Guam's Delegate 8 to Congress and to the Governor of Guam; and 9 The Legislature further finds that failure to act at this 10 time could lead to serious environmental injury to the island 11 and result in a health hazard of unknown magnitude to Guam's 12 The subject of this Act is, therefore, a matter of residents. 1.3 local application subject to legislative enactment by this body 14 in accord with Section 11 of the Organic Act. 15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: 16 Section 1. The Governor, upon receipt of a written 17 request from the United States government, may contract for 18 the Executive Branch to provide on Guam during the period 19 commencing April 30, 1975, and ending June 30, 1975, services 20 essential to the health, safety and welfare of persons 21 evacuated from Indochina. Any contract entered shall be only 22 for services which are to be provided after the effective date 23 of this Act and such a contract shall not have any retroactive 24 25 effect. Section 2. Any contract entered pursuant to Section 1 of 26 this Act shall provide that the government shall be fully 27 reimbursed for all expenditures incurred as a result of 28 services provided at the request of the United States 29 government. Full reimbursement shall include not only the 30 actual cost of personnel and materials supplied but also a 31 reasonable surcharge for administrative overhead and wear and 32 tear on government equipment. 33

Section 3. There is appropriated from the Tourist 1 . Attraction Fund Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000) 2 to fund this Act. This appropriation shall be a loan and the 3 funds received as reimbursement for the services provided are reappropriated to the Tourist Attraction Fund upon receipt 5 from the United States government. 6 Section 4. The certifying officer of the Department of 7 Administration shall be the certifying officer for the 8 appropriation made by Section 3 of this Act. Any sum required 9 to be expended pursuant to this Act shall be drawn from the 10 appropriation made by Section 3 of this Act, provided that in 11 no case shall the total sum expended exceed Two Hundred Fifty 12 Thousand Dollars (\$250,000). 13 The Director of Administration shall maintain Section 5. 14 records of all costs incurred in providing any service for 15 which a contract has been entered pursuant to this Act. 16 Director of Administration shall file with the Legislative 17 Secretary a complete report of all costs incurred and all 18 funds received as a result of any contract entered pursuant to 19 The report shall be filed within ten days after the 20 this Act. last day of the month in which the cost was incurred or the 21 22 funds received. Section 6. The Governor shall file with the Legislative 23 Secretary a copy of any contract entered pursuant to this Act. 24 The contract shall be filed within three days of the date it is 25 26 executed. Section 7. Within ten days of the effective date of this 27 Act the Director of Administration shall submit a report to the 28 Legislative Secretary itemizing any expenditures which may have 29 been made by any agency of the Executive Branch for the period 30 commencing April 20, 1975, for any service provided for persons 31 32 evacuated to Guam from Indochina. Section 8. During the period commencing April 30, 1975, 33

and ending June 30, 1975, no funds shall be expended pursuant to Section 6113 of the Government Code for any purpose related to evacuation of persons from Indochina.
