AN ACT TO REVISE CHAPTER II OF TITLE XXVII OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM RELATIVE TO THE OPERATION OF COCKPITS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 26104 of the Government Code of Guam is repealed in its entirety and a new Section 26104 is enacted to read:

"Section 26104. Cockpits, authorization to license.

The Board is authorized to issue cockpit licenses for both

"Balentia" and 'Amara' cockpits. 'Balentia' cockfighting

shall be that in which the cocks are not equipped with

knives or other sharp instruments. 'Amara' cockfighting

shall be that in which the cocks are equipped with knives

or other sharp instruments. The Board may authorize a

licensee to conduct either or both kinds of cockfighting."

Section 2. Sections 26106 and 26187 of the Government Codo

of Guam are repealed in their entirety and a new Section 26106

is enacted to read:

"Section 26106. Bids, invitation for and submission of:

(a) The Board shall annually conduct a public meeting at which it shall review cockpit operations and

determine whether there is a need for additional 1 2 licenses to be granted. Upon determining such a need exists or not later 3 (b) than 90 days prior to the expiration of an existing license the Board shall publish in a newspaper of 5 general circulation within the territory its in-6 vitation for bids. The invitation for bids shall specify the type 8 (c) 9 of license to be granted and the municipality in which the license is intended to be granted. 10 11 (d) The notice shall be published at least once weekly for three consecutive weeks. The notice shall 12 state the address to which bids must be submitted 13 and shall set a deadline, which shall be 30 days 14 15 following the day of last publication of notice, for the submission of bids. 16 No bid for amara shall be considered unless it 17 (o) shall be accompanied by a deposit of \$100.00 which 18 19 sum shall not be refundable and which shall be paid into the General Fund of Guam. 20 No bid shall be considered unless it shall be 21 (£) 22 submitted in a scaled envelope. 23 (g) The minimum bid which can be received or 24 accepted by the Board for the operation of a 25 cockpit in which amera fights may be conducted 26 shall be \$10,000 for five (5) years. 27 The minimum bid which can be received or (h) 28 accepted by the Board for the operation of a - 2 -

cockpit in which only balentia fights may be 1 conducted shall be \$50.00 per year." 2 Section 3. Section 26108 of the Government Code of Guam 3 is hereby amended to read as follows: "Section 26108. License, award of. The Board shall 5 award the license to the highest bidder provided that the bidder is approved by the Board. In the event that the Board does not approve the highest bidder, or the highest 8 bid is for any reason not acceptable to the Board, new 9 notices shall be posted and bids received in the same 10 manner as if no notice had been given." 11 Section 4. Sections 26109 through 26112 are repealed in 12 their entirety and a new Section 26109 is enacted to read: 13 "Section 26109. License, duration of; number of 14 suspension or revocation of; citizenship requirement for. 15 16 License for any cockpit shall be issued for a 17 five-year period. 18 The Board, acting pursuant to Section 26110, (b) 19 shall have discretion to determine the number 20 of licenses that may be issued, provided, however, that not more than one license shall 21 22 be issued in any municipality of less than 10,000 population. The Board may issue one 23 24 additional license for each additional 10,000 25 porsons residing within a municipality 26 of more than 10,000 population. 27 (c) The Board may suspend or revoke a license for 28 violation of any section of this Chapter or of - 3 -

the rules and regulations issued pursuant thereto. Any action for suspension or revocation shall be processed as provided by the Administrative Adjudication Law.

(d) The Board shall not issue a license to any natural person who is not a citizen of the United States and a resident of Guam nor to a legal entity in which the ownership is not at least 51 per cent vested in citizens of the United States who are residents of Guam."

Section 5. This Act shall be effective upon the expiration of the term of the last Amara license issued prior to the passage of this Act. Also, its provision shall not impair the terms of any existing cockpit license now existing, provided, however, that no existing license shall be renewed except as provided for in this Act.
