AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 13052 (a) PL-11-82, SECTION 1, OF PUBLIC LAW 12-109 RELATIVE TO EARMARKING THE LIQUID FUELS TAX FOR THE HIGHWAY FUND, DESIGNATING THE GOVERNOR'S HIGHWAY SAFETY REPRESENTATIVE, ESTABLISHING THE OFFICE OF THE TERRITORIAL HIGHWAY SAFETY PROGRAM WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS AND ENUMERATING ITS AUTHORITIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES, AND MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE FY-75 TERRITORIAL HIGHWAY SAFETY PROGRAM.

BE IT HMACTED BY THE PROPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. Section 10352 (a) of Public Law 11-82 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Section 10352 (a). For the purpose of securing for the entire territory proper maintenance and construction of existing highways, including roads and city and village streets, and coastruction of needed new public highways, including roads and city and village streets and for implementing all highway-safety related plans, programs and projects, there is hereby established a fund to be known as the 'Territorial Highway Fund', which fund to be maintained separate and apart from any other funds of the Government of Guam, and independent records shall be kept in connection therewith." Section 2. Section 1 of Public Law 12-109 is hereby amended

to read as follows:

"Section 1 (PL 12-109). For the period beginning 1 July 1, 1971 and ending June 30, 1979 all monies received 2 under Subchapter D, Chapter 6, Title XX and Section 23354, 3 Chapter 3, Title XXIV, Government Code of Guam and monies ã and revenue made available from the Federal Government 5 for public highway purposes and highway safety related plans, 6 programs and projects shall be deposited with Territorial 7 Highway Fund. Accounting procedures for the funds shall be prescribed by the Director of Administration and suitable 9 reserves shall be maintained for tax drawbacks under this 10 Subchapter which shall be paid from the fund." 11 Section 3. Consistent with the Governor's Highway Safety 12 Representative and Office of Highway Safety policies and pro-13 cedures of the U.S. Department of Transportation, there is 14 15

hereby assigned the Director of Public Works to be the Governor's designate as the Highway Safety Representative for the territory.

Section 4. There is hereby established within the Department of Public Works the Office of Highway Safety to be staffed by officers and employees of Department assigned by the Director of Public Works. The Office of Highway Safety shall assist the Director of Public Works in all functions relating to all highway safety standards established by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration and the Pederal Highway Administration agencies of the U.S. Department of Transportation. The Governor's Highway Safety Representative shall have the authority and responsibility to:

the laws of Guam on behalf of the territory for federally funded highway safety projects; and

K. Represent the territory in all other matters coming under the purview of the Highway Safety Act.

Section 6. There is hereby appropriated the sum of Three Hundred Twenty Four Thousand Mine Hundred Sixty Dollars (\$324,960) of federal grants-in-mid funds from the Federal Highway Safety Act of 1966 (as amended) to implement the Fiscal Year 1975 Guam Highway Safety-Related Program.
