Introduced by C. T. C. Gutierrez

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 1 OF PUBLIC
LAW 11-100 TO AUTHORIZE THE DIRECTOR
OF PUBLIC WORKS TO ACQUIRE ON BEHALF
OF THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM EITHER FEE
TITLE TO OR PERPETUAL EASEMENT OF RE-
QUIRED WIDTH OVER THOSE PORTIONS OF
VILLAGE STREETS TO WHICH LEGAL TITLE
IS STILL VESTED IN PRIVATE OWNERS.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law 11-100 is hereby
3 amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 1. Authorization for land taking. Notwith-
5 standing any other provisions of law, the Director of Public
6 Works is hereby authorized to acquire on behalf of the
7 government of Guam either fee title to, or perpetual easement
8 of required width over those portions of the primary and
9 secondary roads, and village streets of the territorial
10 highway system to which legal title is still vested in
11 private owners. In making such acquisitions, the director
12 shall pay no more than the fair market value therefor and
13 in the event a landowner refuses the offer of payment
14 tendered by the director, the matter shall be referred to
15 the Attorney General for appropriate action under the
16 provisions of the Code of Civil Procedure relating to
17 eminent domain. The Legislature hereby declares the
18 acquisition of such rights of way to be in the public
19 interest."
