AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE SETTING ASIDE AND  
LONG-TERM LEASING OF GOVERNMENT LAND FOR  
A MULTI-PURPOSE SPEEDWAY PARK.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Statement of legislative findings. The legis-  
3 lature finds that there is an increasing number of enthusiasts  
4 in Guam who are intensely interested in motor vehicles, parti-  
5 cularly fast automobiles and motorcycles; that the sport of  
6 racing automobiles and motorcycles is a sport of increasing  
7 popularity in Guam; that under conditions of control and rigid  
8 safety requirements, motor vehicle racing has been proven to  
9 be a safe and enjoyable sport for millions of people, one that  
10 channels useful energies and talents into the extremely  
11 difficult not to say archaic art of propelling a motor vehicle  
12 from a standing start over a quarter of a mile in less than  
13 seven seconds; that motor vehicle racing is now going on in  
14 Guam but not at a supervised race course and that such lack  
15 of supervision has already resulted in a major tragedy; that  
16 rather than attempting to prohibit racing altogether it would  
17 be in the best interest of the people of Guam to provide a  
18 public motor speedway park to be controlled by an organization  
19 of professional enthusiasts where rigid safety requirements  
20 can be maintained; that an automotive sports facility can be  
21 designed to take care of all possible motor vehicle racing  
22 activities; drag racing, stock car racing, motorcycle racing  
23 and instruction for high performance driving, serving not only

1 as a community facility but also as a tourist attraction and  
2 that the operation of an integrated racing facility can be  
3 self supporting.

4 Section 2. The Governor is hereby authorized to reserve  
5 sufficient government land in that unsurveyed government land  
6 West of Salisbury Junction in Yigo and including but not  
7 limited to that area designated for the public drag strip  
8 pursuant to Section 1.VI.E of Public Law 10-171, for the  
9 construction of a multi-purpose speedway park and to enter into  
10 a long-term agreement with a non-profit private organization  
11 for the construction and operation of such multi-purpose  
12 automotive racing park. "In the event the Governor finds the  
13 area described hereinabove unsatisfactory for the construction  
14 of a multi-purpose speedway park, the Governor is authorized  
15 to lease any other government of Guam land, provided, however,  
16 that such lease has the concurrence of the Legislature."

17 In implementing this Section the Governor shall comply with  
18 Section 3 of Public Law 12-61.

19 "Section 3. In the event that persons are displaced  
20 because of the reservation authorized by Section 2, the  
21 Chamorro Land Trust Commission shall give those persons first  
22 priority to other vacant and unoccupied government land."
