AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE SETTING ASIDE AND LONG-TERM LEASING OF GOVERNMENT LAND FOR A MULTI-PURPOSE SPEEDWAY PARK.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Statement of legislative findings. The legislature finds that there is an increasing number of enthusiasts in Guam who are intensely interested in motor vehicles, particularly fast automobiles and motorcycles; that the sport of racing automobiles and motorcycles is a sport of increasing popularity in Guam; that under conditions of control and rigid safety requirements, motor vehicle racing has been proven to be a safe and enjoyable sport for millions of people, one that channels useful energies and talents into the extremely difficult not to say archaic art of propelling a motor vehicle from a standing start over a quarter of a mile in less than seven seconds; that motor vehicle racing is now going on in Guam but not at a supervised race course and that such lack of supervision has already resulted in a major tragedy; that rather than attempting to prohibit racing altogether it would be in the best interest of the people of Guam to provide a public motor speedway park to be controlled by an organization of professional enthusiasts where rigid safety requirements can be maintained; that an automotive sports facility can be designed to take care of all possible motor vehicle racing activities; drag racing, stock car racing, motorcycle racing and instruction for high performance driving, serving not only

as a community facility but also as a tourist attraction and that the operation of an integrated racing facility can be self supporting.

Section 2. The Governor is hereby authorized to reserve sufficient government land in that unsurveyed government land West of Salisbury Junction in Yigo and including but not limited to that area designated for the public drag strip pursuant to Section 1.VI.E of Public Law 10-171, for the construction of a multi-purpose speedway park and to enter into a long-term agreement with a non-profit private organization for the construction and operation of such multi-purpose automotive racing park. "In the event the Governor finds the area described hereinabove unsatisfactory for the construction of a multi-purpose speedway park, the Governor is authorized to lease any other government of Guam land, provided, however, that such lease has the concurrence of the Legislature."

In implementing this Section the Governor shall comply with Section 3 of Public Law 12-61.

"Section 3. In the event that persons are displaced because of the reservation authorized by Section 2, the Chamorro Land Trust Commission shall give those persons first priority to other vacant and unoccupied government land."
