AN ACT TO REPEAL AND REENACT TITLE LXIV OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE TO ESTABLISH A PUBLIC DEPENDER SERVICE CORPORATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PROPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Title LXIV of the Government Code is repealed and a new Title LXIV is enacted to read:

#### "Witle LXIV

Public Defender Service Corporation Act

Section 60000. Short Title. This Charter may be cited as the 'Public Defender Service Corporation Act of 1975.'

Section 69001. Definitions. (a) 'Corporation' means the Public Defender Service: Cornoration.

- 'Board' means the Board of Trustees of the Public Defender Service Corporation.
- 'Director' means the Director of the Public Defender Service Corporation.

Section 60002. Establishment. In order to provide effective legal aid and assistance to those persons in Guam who are unable to afford counsel, there is created a public corporation to be known as Public Defender Service Corporation.

Section 60003. Duties: Criminal Cases. It shall be the duty of the Corporation to defend indigent persons charged in criminal cases before the courts of Guam. determination of whether a defendant is indigent and whether his case is to be referred to the Corporation shall be at the discretion of the judge before whom such defendant is appearing. The Corporation may assist the judges of the courts of Guam in ruling on cases of indigency and in establishing criteria for determining when the services

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of the Corporation are appropriate.

Section 60004. Duties: Civil Matters. The Corporation shall render legal aid and assistance to those persons in Guam, who, under rules established by the Corporation, are in need of legal assistance and representation, and who are unable to afford an attorney in private practice. The Corporation shall not compete with attorneys engaged in the private practice of law in Guam and shall give legal assistance in civil matters only to those who would otherwise not receive such assistance.

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Section 60005. Powers. The Corporation has the power to do any and all things necessary to further the purposes of this Chapter and to perform the duties imposed by Sections 60003 and 60004.

Vested in the Corporation, except as otherwise provided in this Chapter shall be exercised by the Board. The Board shall consist of five (5) trustees: the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Guam, who shall be chairman; the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court of Guam, who shall be vice-chairman; the Chairman of the Committee on Judiciary of the Legislature; the President of the Cuam Bar Association; and one (1) member appointed by the Governor of Guam, whose term shall be for three (3) years. The person appointed by the Governor shall not be the Attorney General nor a member of his staff. The Trustees shall not be employees of the Corporation.

(b) Three (3) Trustees shall constitute a quorum of the Board for the transaction of all business. Subject to the provisions of the Administrative Adjudication Act, the Board may adopt rules and regulations governing the conduct of its affairs.

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. Section 60004. Sation: Civil Satters. The Corporation

Director who shall have at least five (5) years experience in the practice of law. The Director shall be a member of the classified service. The Director shall have the sole responsibility to carry out the purposes and duties of the Corporation.

Section 60008. Personnel. The Director is authorized to appoint a Deputy Director, and such other personnel, and fix their duties, under and in accordance with Title V. Government Code, as may be necessary for purposes of this Chapter.

Section 60009. Employment. (a) Pursuant to the provisions of Section 4004 of the Government Code, the Board shall establish rules and regulations governing selection, promotion, performance evaluation, demotion, suspension, and other disciplinary action for the employees of the Corporation.

Employees of the Corporation shall be members of (b) the Government of Guam Retirement Fund, subject to the provisions of Section 4204 of the Government Code, except that for the purposes of Subsection (a) of said Section, the employees of the Corporation shall not be considered employees of a 'public corporation', whereby their membership in the Fund is optional and membership therein must be specifically requested. The Corporation shall contribute to the Government of Guam Retirement Fund on the basis of annual billings as determined by the Board of Trustees, Government of Guam Retirement Fund, for the government share of the cost of the retirement benefits applicable to the Corporation's employees and their beneficiaries. The Corporation shall also contribute to the Workmen's Compensa tion Fund, on the basis of annual billings as determined

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Saction 60007. Director. The Board shall appoint a

by the Worksen's Compensation Corressioner, for the benefit payments made from such Fund on account of the Corporation's employees.

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Section 60010. Attornays. The attornays employed by the Corporation may practice before the courts of Cuam on the same busis as other government attorneys pursuant to Section 28002.2 of the Government Code.

Employees of. The Director shall be a successor to the Public Defender of Guam. All employees of the office of the Public Defender of Guam. All employees of the office of the Public Defender of Guam shall be transferred to the Public Defender Service Corporation.

Any person accepting employment under this Section shall receive not less than the straight-time rate of compensation he was receiving immediately before the transfer date. The other employment banefits and rights, including retirement and leave, of such transferred employees shall be governed by the previsions of Section 50009 of this Chapter.

Section 60012. Fiscal Authority Accounting; Expenditures.

- the 'Public Defender Service Corporation Fund', which shall be maintained by the General Administrative Services of the Judicial Branch separate and apart from other funds of the Government, and independent records and accounts shall be maintained in connection therewith. Every quarter the financial statement of the Fund shall be furnished the Cuam Legislature.
- (b) All moneys received by the Corporation, from whatever source derived, shall be deposited in said Public Defender Service Corporation Fund in eligible banks as defined in Section 6311 of the Government Code.

- (c) All expenditures shall be made from said Public Defender Service Corroration Fund.
- (d) The Board shall adopt and maintain a uniform system of accounting.

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Section 60013. Transfer of Property. There is transferred to the Corporation all items of property now assigned to the Office of the Public Referder of Guar."

Section 2. This Act shall take effect 30-days upon its enactment.
