AN ACT EMEING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE FAREES MAINTING REVOLVING FUND, AS AUTHORIZED BY PUBLIC LAW 12-169.

WHEREAS, Public Law 12-169 outsblished the Farmers Marketing Revolving Fund and Marketing Board to assist local farmers in marketing locally-produced goods; and

WHEREAS, given the current state of the economy, it is imperative that the farmers of Guan be given all assistance possible in selling their goods, for in many cases such farmers do not have the wherewithal to be both farmers and sellers; and

WHEREAS, Public Law 12-169 authorized an appropriation of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) to the Fund; now, therefore

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PROPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. The amount of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) is hereby transferred to the Ceneral Fund from the Hospital Construction Fund and said sum is hereby appropriated to the Farmer's Marketing Pavolving Fund as anthonized by Public Law 12-169.

Section 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Office of the Independent Special Prosecutor the sum of Forty Thousand Seven Hundred Eighty-Five Dollars (\$40,785.00) to be expended as follows:

- (a) For personal services, not to exceed \$29,222.00
- (b) For personnel benefits, not to exceed \$ 2,818.00

(b) Any litigation which may have been instituted by the Office of the Independent Special Prosecutor and which is still pending is transferred to the jurisdiction of the Attorney General for such further actions he may determine.

(c) All records of any nature whatsoever and all equipment and supplies of any nature whatsoever in the possession of the Office of the Independent Special Prosecutor are transferred to the Department of Law.

Section 5. Commencing with the effective date of this Act and in accordance with the intent of Section 4 of this Act the Special Presecutor shall closely coordinate his activities with the Attorney General is order to effectuate a smooth and orderly transition of the duties and responsibilities of the Office of the Independent Special Presecutor to the Department of Law.
