AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE
FARMERS MARKETING REVOLVING FUND, AS
AUTHORIZED BY PUBLIC LAW 12-169.

1 WHEREAS, Public Law 12-169 established the Farmers Market-
2 ing Revolving Fund and Marketing Board to assist local farmers
3 in marketing locally-produced goods; and

4 WHEREAS, given the current state of the economy, it is
5 imperative that the farmers of Guam be given all assistance
6 possible in selling their goods, for in many cases such farmers
7 do not have the wherewithal to be both farmers and sellers; and

8 WHEREAS, Public Law 12-169 authorized an appropriation of
9 Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) to the Fund; now, there-
10 fore

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

12 Section 1. The amount of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00)
13 is hereby transferred to the General Fund from the Hospital
14 Construction Fund and said sum is hereby appropriated to the
15 Farmer's Marketing Revolving Fund as authorized by Public
16 Law 12-169.

17 Section 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund
18 to the Office of the Independent Special Prosecutor the sum
19 of Forty Thousand Seven Hundred Eighty-Five Dollars (\$40,785.00)
20 to be expended as follows:

21 (a) For personal services, not	
22 to exceed	\$29,222.00
23 (b) For personnel benefits, not	
24 to exceed	\$ 2,818.00

- 1 (c) For travel and transportation,
 2 not to exceed Four Thousand
 3 Dollars (\$4,000.00) as follows:
 4 (1) For off-island travel for
 5 termination, not to exceed \$ 4,000.00
 6 (d) For contractual services, not
 7 to exceed \$ 4,505.00
 8 (e) For supplies and materials, not
 9 to exceed \$ 107.00
 10 (f) For miscellaneous items, not
 11 to exceed One Hundred Thirty
 12 Three Dollars (\$133.00) as
 13 follows:
 14 (1) Court fees, not to exceed \$ 75.00
 15 (2) Surety bonds, not to
 16 exceed \$ 18.00
 17 (3) Documents from District
 18 Court, not to exceed \$ 40.00

19 Section 3. The appropriation made by Section 2 of this
 20 Act shall be utilized to fund the operations of the Office of
 21 the Independent Special Prosecutor for the period July 1, 1975,
 22 through September 12, 1975. Any portion of the sum appropriated
 23 by Section 2 of this Act which is not encumbered by September 12,
 24 1975, shall revert to the General Fund.

25 Section 4. Effective September 13, 1975:

- 26 (a) The Office of the Independent Special
 27 Prosecutor is abolished and Public Law
 28 12-173, as amended, is repealed.

1 (b) Any litigation which may have been instituted
2 by the Office of the Independent Special
3 Prosecutor and which is still pending is
4 transferred to the jurisdiction of the
5 Attorney General for such further actions
6 he may determine.

7 (c) All records of any nature whatsoever and all
8 equipment and supplies of any nature whatsoever
9 in the possession of the Office of the In-
10 dependent Special Prosecutor are transferred
11 to the Department of Law.

12 Section 5. Commencing with the effective date of this Act
13 and in accordance with the intent of Section 4 of this Act the
14 Special Prosecutor shall closely coordinate his activities
15 with the Attorney General in order to effectuate a smooth
16 and orderly transition of the duties and responsibilities
17 of the Office of the Independent Special Prosecutor to the
18 Department of Law.
