AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE INTERSCHOLASTICS PROGRAM OF THE DEPART-MENT OF EDUCATION AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. A new subsection VII.B.a, which shall follow subsection VII.A.c., is added to Section 2, Part One, of Public Law 13-37:

24		Section 4. Section 35 of Part Six, Public Law 13-37,

regulations to the contrary, any authorized position

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funded by this Act which is vacant on the date of passage of this Act shall remain vacant, unless such postion contributes directly to the health or safety of Guam residents and is deemed immediately necessary to such program areas. Additionally, any vacant position which is entirely federally funded during this and future fiscal year, and any position which will be revenue producing and will directly cause more revenues to be realized by the government of Guam may also be filled. This section shall not apply to the filling of vacancies in classroom teaching positions, professorial positions, and cafeteria workers positions, provided that the term cafeteria worker position shall not include cafeteria managers or administrative and clerical personnel."

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Section 5. Section 39(d) of Part Six of Public Law 13-37 is amended to read:

"(d). Each teacher shall spend not less than 300 minutes of each school day instructing pupils. This may be accomplished by establishing five (5) 60-minute periods or six (6) 50-minute periods for each for each teacher. Pupils are to be provided 300 minutes of instruction each school day provided, however, that this provision shall not apply to kindergarten pupils, whose instructional time shall be as established by the Department of Education."

Section 6. There is hereby authorized to be appropriated

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from any available funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund, the sum of One Hundred Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$180,000) for the operation of the Therapeutic Community Center as established by Public Law 12-81.

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Section 7. Section 4 of Part Six of Public Law 13-37 is amended to read:

"Section 4. None of the appropriations made pursuant to Section 2 through 7, Part One of this Act (appropriations from the General Fund) shall be used to pay for obligations committed, or expenditures made, prior to July 1, 1975, consistent with Section 20, Part Six of this Act with the exception that appropriations for the payment of telephone expenses in Section 5, Part One, of this Act may be used for the payment of telephone expenses incurred during FY '75; said expenditures for said telephone expenses shall be subject to the approval of the Director of the Bureau of Budget and Management Research."
