AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 16200 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM AND TO ADD SECTIONS 16204, 16204.1, 16204.2, 16204.3 AND 16204.4, ALL OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO REQUIRE THAT ALL TOURIST GUIDES OBTAIN A LICENSE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. Section 16200 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

Every person "Section 16200. License required. engaged in or carrying on any service business or calling, which shall include all nonprofessional activities engaged in for other persons for consideration, involving the rendering of a service as distinguished \* from the production or sale of tangible property, but not including the services rendered by an employee to his employer other than by tourist guides, shall be required to annually obtain a service license. The annual fee for service license shall be Fifty Dollars (\$50.00).

Section 2. New Sections 16204, 16204.1, 16204.2, 16204.3 and 16204.4 are hereby added to the Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

"Section 16204. Additional Requirements for Tourist Guides. (a) In addition to paying the fee required by Section 16200, all persons performing services as tourist guides must, prior to licensing, produce evidence of having passed the examination provided for herein covering the history and culture of Guam, provided that any person applying for a service license as a tourist guide for the first time after the enactment of this Act may be issued one (1) temporary license which shall be valid for a period not to exceed one hundred twenty (120) days only.

(b) No tourist guide license shall be issued to any person who is not of good moral character, or who has been convicted of the use of controlled substances, as the same are defined in the Uniform Controlled Substances Act, or who has been convicted of a crime involving moral turpitude, the illegal use of firearms or violence.

Section 16204.1. Renewal licenses. Once an individual is licensed as a tourist guide, no new examination upon the subjects referred to in Section 16204 above may be required of said individual until three (3) years have elapsed from the date of taking the previous examination.

administer. The Guam Visitors Bureau is hereby authorized to develop, write and administer the examination for tourist guides required by Section 16204 and 16204.1 of the Government Code. The Board of Directors of the Guam Visitors Bureau shall make such rules and regulations as may be necessary to carry out the purposes of this Act. The Guam Visitors Bureau may promulgate standards of conduct to be observed by licensed tourist

guides, including the prohibition of the practice commonly known as 'touting'. Said standards of conduct shall be designed with the intent of insuring that licensed tourist guides do not act in such a manner as to bring discredit upon Guam, its people and its businesses. Said rules and regulations and standards shall be promulgated in accordance with the Administrative Adjudication Act.

Section 16204.3. Violations. (a) The Board of Directors of the Guam Visitors Bureau may, after proceeding in accordance with the Administrative Adjudication Act, order the revocation of the license of any tourist guide, or the suspension of any such license, for a period not to exceed one (1) year, for violation by said tourist guide of any of the rules and regulations or standards of conduct promulgated by the Guam Visitors Bureau. Any person whose license has been revoked by the Guam Visitors Bureau shall not be eligible to reapply for the same class of license until a period of three (3) years has elapsed from the date of revocation. Upon such reapplication the applicant shall be treated as a new applicant except that he shall not be eligible for a temporary license.

- (b) Any person who is required by the terms of this Title to obtain a license as a tourist guide and refuses or fails to obtain such license shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and punished under Section 16017 of this Title.
  - (c) Any person who uses, attempts to use or has

in his possession with intent to use any tourist guide
license not issued to him or, if such license issued
to him was issued on account of misrepresentation to
the Guam Visitors Bureau or to the Dopartment of
Revenue and Taxation, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor
and punished by a fine of not more than One Thousand
Dollars (\$1,000.00) or by imprisonment of not more
than one (1) year, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 16204.4. Tourist Guide defined. A tourist guide, as the term is used in Sections 16204 through 16204.4 is defined as any person who, for compensation of any kind, undertakes to guide, direct, lead or conduct tourist and who, while undertaking such duties, explains to or informs said tourists of the history and culture of Guam, or directs the tourists to scenic, cultural or historic sites on Guam, or leads tour groups while the same are on conducted shopping tours of Guam. This definition shall not include a person whose sole occupation is to drive a tour bus or other tour vehicle, but who does not actually engage in any of the activities described above. However, this definition shall include a person driving a tour vehicle on a conducted tour if said person is the only non-tourist on said vehicle or if said individual arranges for a conducted shopping tour, or if said individual acts in the generally accepted role of the 'tour guide'."
