




CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR

This is to certify that Substitute Bill No. 584, "An Act to amend Section 4010.1 of the Government Code relative to lay-offs and for other purposes", which was heretofore passed and thereafter on September 26, 1975, returned to the Legislature without the approval of the Governor was, in accordance with the Organic Act of Guam, reconsidered by the Legislature and after such reconsideration the Legislature did on the 10th day of October, 1975, agree to pass said bill notwithstanding the objections of the Governor by a vote of two-thirds of all the members thereof, to wit: by a vote of 15 members.

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 4010.1 OF THE  
GOVERNMENT CODE RELATIVE TO LAYOFFS AND  
FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 4010.1 of the Government Code is here-  
3 by amended to read:

4 "Section 4010.1. Same: Layoffs: notice. Notwith-  
5 standing any other provision of law, rule or regulation to  
6 the contrary, all employees, including casual employees, of  
7 the government of Guam who have been employed for a period  
8 of not less than two hundred and sixty (260) working days  
9 shall be entitled to written notice of at least sixty (60)  
10 days prior to their removal or layoff for any reason, in-  
11 cluding layoffs due to reorganization, lack of work or  
12 funds or for any other reason beyond the control of the  
13 employee. In the absence of the written notice provided for  
14 herein, any attempt to remove or layoff any employee shall  
15 be void and the employee shall be continued in pay status  
16 until sixty (60) days after he has been given written  
17 notice of his removal or layoff."

18 Section 2. The Governor shall offer employment in govern-  
19 ment service to all employees of the Commercial Port who have  
20 received notification that pursuant to a management reorganiza-

1 tion plan authorized by Executive Order 75-41 their services are  
2 to be terminated. The employment that is to be offered shall  
3 be for vacant positions with the Executive Branch for which  
4 funding has been appropriated by the Legislature. In the event  
5 the Governor determines that there are not sufficient positions  
6 to accommodate the offer of government service to all of the  
7 persons affected by the termination notification which resulted  
8 from Executive Order 75-41, he shall notify the Legislature in  
9 writing at least fifteen (15) days before the termination date  
10 and provide a list of names of persons to whom government service  
11 positions cannot be offered.

12 Section 3. Nothing in the Act shall authorize the retention  
13 of any employee by any government agency in violation of the  
14 provisions of Section 6118 of the Government Code of Guam.
