

AN ACT TO REPEAL AND REENACT SECTION 1004 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE TO PROVIDE FOR THE DAY ON WHICH THE TERM OF A SENATOR TO THE GUAM LEGISLATURE SHALL COMMENCE AND TO AMEND SECTION 1015 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE RELATIVE TO THE COMMENCEMENT AND ADJOURNMENT OF REGULAR SESSIONS OF THE GUAM LEGISLATURE AND TO DESIGNATE THE FIRST AND SECOND REGULAR SESSIONS OF EACH LEGISLATURE.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 1004 of the Government Code is
3 repealed and reenacted to read:

4 "Section 1004. Senators, terms of. Senators elected
5 to the Guam Legislature shall hold office for a term of
6 two (2) years and until their successors are elected and
7 qualified. The term of Senators elected to the Guam
8 Legislature shall commence on the first Monday of
9 January following the date of election."

10 Section 2. Section 1015 of the Government Code is
11 amended to read:

12 "Section 1015. Legislature. Convening and
13 adjourning of sessions; carry over from odd-year
14 regular sessions; first and second regular sessions.

15 (a) The Legislature shall convene in regular session
16 at the seat of government at 5 p.m., on the first Monday
17 in January of each year, for ten (10) legislative days
18 and thereafter every first Monday for ten (10) legislative
19 days of each month through December.

1 (b) A session, either regular or special, shall
2 adjourn without day at 12 midnight or earlier on a day
3 determined by resolution of the Legislature; provided,
4 however, that in no event shall a regular session of the
5 Legislature continue beyond December 31. In the event the
6 Legislature shall have failed to adopt a resolution for
7 final adjournment by December 31 the session shall be
8 automatically adjourned by midnight on that day. Nothing
9 herein shall prevent the Governor from calling a special
10 session of the Legislature as authorized by the provisions
11 of the Organic Act of Guam. Nothing herein shall prevent
12 the Speaker or the Rule Making Committee of the Legislature
13 from calling a session of the Legislature.

14 (c) Any business, bill, or resolution pending at
15 the final adjournment of a regular session held in an
16 odd-numbered year shall carry over with the same status
17 to the next regular session.

18 (d) The session convening in the odd-numbered
19 years shall be the first regular session of a Legislature
20 and the session convening in the even-numbered years
21 shall be the second regular session of the Legislature
22 organized the preceding year."
