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AN ACT ADDING A NEW SECTION 11116 TO THE GOVERNMENT CODE REQUIRING THE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO DESIGN, DEVELOP AND IMPLE-MENT A CRIME PREVENTION AND DRUG ABUSE EDUCATION PROGRAM IN THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

Statement of Legislative Finding: Because of the complexity of the motives which underlie acts of juvenile crime and drug abuse, it is desirable that all students in grades kindergarten through twelve be involved in a well planned sequential program designed to combat juvenile delinquency and drug abuse.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. A new Section 11116 is hereby added to the

Government Code to read as follows:

"Section 11116. The Board shall develop a crime prevention and drug abuse education program for all students in the public schools of Guam taking into consideration the age and grade level of the students involved. The primary objective of the program shall be to combat juvenile crime and drug abuse. The Board shall cause to be developed a curriculum consistent with the objectives of this program. Said curriculum shall take into consideration the concepts of human growth and development, values clarification, citizenship, physical and mental health, personal and social relationships, and use of leisure time.

The Board shall cause to be conducted both preservice and in-service teacher training programs which shall provide for the effective implementation of the program. The Board shall also provide consultive services to the individual schools within the Department of Education through the use of coordinators."
