AN ACT TO REPEAL CHAPTER VIII OF TITLE IX AND TO ADD A NEW CHAPTER III TO TITLE XXVII OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE RELATIVE TO A BOXING AND WRESTLING COMMISSION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Chapter VIII of Title IX of the Government Code is repealed.

Section 2. A new Chapter III is added to Title XXVII of the Government Code to read:

"CHAPTER III

Boxing and Wrestling Commission

Section 26200. Creation. There is within the Department of Parks and Recreation the Guam Boxing and Wrestling Commission, hereinafter referred to as the 'Commission', to be composed of five (5) members appointed by the Governor with the consent of the Legislature.

Section 26201. Compensation and term. members shall serve without compensation for a term of two (2) years provided that of the members first appointed three (3) shall serve for one (1) year and two (2) shall serve for two (2) years.

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Section 26202. Powers. The Commission shall have the following powers:

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- (1) To cooperate with organizations and individuals engaged in the promotion and control of amateur boxing and wrestling;
- (2) To supervise and regulate boxing and wrestling exhibitions and contests which are conducted for prizes or purses, or where an admission fee is charged; and
- (3) To make and amend such rules and regulations as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this Chapter, including but not limited to regulations establishing minimum medical standards for pre-fight examinations and medical guidelines to be observed during matches.

Section 26203. Permits. No boxing or wrestling exhibitions or contests may be held unless the promoter thereof first obtains a written permit from the Commission. Such permit shall not be issued unless the promoter agrees to accord the Commission the right to examine the financial records relating to the exhibition or contest for which the permit is issued. The Commission may, after a hearing conducted in accordance with the Administrative Adjudication Law, revoke such permit for violation by the permittee of any rule or resolution of the Commission or for other cause.

Section 26204. Licenses. No person shall promote, engage, or participate in any boxing or wrestling exhibitions or contests without first obtaining a license issued in accordance with Section 26205 herein. The Commission may, after a hearing conducted in accordance with the Administrative Adjudication Law, revoke any such license

for violation by the licensee of any rule or regulation of the Commission, or for other cause.

Section 26205. Same: issuance. Upon receipt of a certificate of the Commission approving the applicant for a license under the provisions of this Chapter, the Department of Revenue and Taxation shall issue such licenses upon payment of the fee prescribed, and such licenses shall expire, regardless of when issued, on the 31st day of December of the year in which issued. All license fees shall be prorated and one-fourth (1/4) of the annual fee shall be paid for each quarter or portion of a quarter remaining in the calendar year from the date of issuance.

Section 26206. Conditions: Boxing. Boxing exhibitions or contests shall comply with the following, except in championship fights where the Commission may adopt the rules and regulations of the boxing association for which the championship is being sought:

- (a) No round shall exceed three (3) minutes.
- (b) There shall be an interval of one (1) minute between each round and the succeeding round.
- (c) Each contestant shall use gloves of not less than eight (8) ounces each in weight.
- (d) No single match shall consist of more than ten
 (10) rounds, provided that a match certified by the
 Commission as a championship match may consist of not more
 than fifteen (15) rounds.
- (e) No contestant shall be permitted to fight unless he has been physically examined by a licensed physician within forty-eight (48) hours of the staging of the match and pronounced physically qualified to fight.
 - (f) A duly licensed physician shall be in attendance

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at ringside.

(g) No contestant shall be permitted to fight unless he has been physically present on the island for at least one (1) week prior to the fight.

Section 26207. Same. Wrestling. All wrestling exhibitions or contests shall comply with the following:

- (a) No contestant shall be permitted to participate unless he has been physically examined by a licensed physician within forty-eight (48) hours of the staging of the exhibition or contest and pronounced physically qualified to wrestle.
- (b) A duly licensed physician shall be in attendance at ringside.
