AN ACT TO REPEAL AND REENACT SECTION 4110 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE RELATIVE TO THE RECRUITMENT OF GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES FROM OUTSIDE OF GUAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 4110 of the Government Code is repealed
and reenacted to read:

"Section 4110. Off-island employees, transportation Upon a finding of necessity made in accordance with Section 4110.3 of this Code, the Governor may employ a person recruited from without Guam upon a contractual basis. . The contract for such a person may provide that the government shall pay for the transportation of the person recruited and his spouse and dependent children and for not more than 2,500 pounds of household effects. transportation allowance for individuals shall be calculated at the lowest prevailing air fare. No portion of the household effects allowance shall be used for the transportation of a motor vehicle. The contract may also provide similar benefits for the return of a person so recruited and his spouse and dependent children and not more than 2,500 pounds of household effects upon the completion of the contract. The government shall not enter into any contract for the employment of any person for a term of less than two years. No person shall be granted more than one contract providing transportation benefits of any kind. A person recruited under a contract providing return transportation to his point of recruitment who is retained in government service after the expiration of his contract may defer utilization of his transportation benefits until his employment with the government ceases or such a person may request at any time after the completion of his contract term that his return transportation benefits be paid to him in cash. Such transportation allowance so paid shall be taxable income to the individual receiving the payment. It is the specific purpose and intent of this section that no person shall be the beneficiary of multiple employment contracts providing for transportation allowances."

Section 2. This Act shall take effect September 1, 1975, and it shall not impair any existing contract executed by and between the government and an employee.

Section 3. Section 1 of Public Law 13-27 is amended to read:

"Section 1. Notwithstanding any provision of law, rules, or regulations to the contrary, the sum of Ninety-Six Thousand Ninety-Seven Dollars (\$96,097) is hereby appropriated from any available fund in the Unappropriated Surplus of the Tourist Attraction Fund for the operation of the Fifth South Pacific Games Commission for the period commencing January 1, 1973, and ending October 31, 1975, said sums to be transferred to the Guam South Pacific Games Commission and to be allocated as follows:"
