Bill No. 426

Introduced by J. F. Ada

AN ACT TO REPEAL AND REENACT SECTION 4110 OF
THE GOVERNMENT CODE RELATIVE TO THE RECRUITMENT
OF GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES FROM OUTSIDE OF GUAM.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 4110 of the Government Code is repealed
3 and reenacted to read:

4 "Section 4110. Off-island employees, transportation
5 of. Upon a finding of necessity made in accordance with
6 Section 4110.3 of this Code, the Governor may employ a
7 person recruited from without Guam upon a contractual
8 basis. The contract for such a person may provide that
9 the government shall pay for the transportation of the
10 person recruited and his spouse and dependent children and
11 for not more than 2,500 pounds of household effects. The
12 transportation allowance for individuals shall be calcu-
13 lated at the lowest prevailing air fare. No portion of
14 the household effects allowance shall be used for the
15 transportation of a motor vehicle. The contract may also
16 provide similar benefits for the return of a person so
17 recruited and his spouse and dependent children and not
18 more than 2,500 pounds of household effects upon the
19 completion of the contract. The government shall not
20 enter into any contract for the employment of any person
21 for a term of less than two years. No person shall be
22 granted more than one contract providing transportation
23 benefits of any kind. A person recruited under a contract

1 providing return transportation to his point of recruitment
2 who is retained in government service after the expiration
3 of his contract may defer utilization of his transportation
4 benefits until his employment with the government ceases
5 or such a person may request at any time after the
6 completion of his contract term that his return trans-
7 portation benefits be paid to him in cash. Such
8 transportation allowance so paid shall be taxable income
9 to the individual receiving the payment. It is the
10 specific purpose and intent of this section that no person
11 shall be the beneficiary of multiple employment contracts
12 providing for transportation allowances."

13 Section 2. This Act shall take effect September 1, 1975,
14 and it shall not impair any existing contract executed by and
15 between the government and an employee.

16 Section 3. Section 1 of Public Law 13-27 is amended to
17 read:

18 "Section 1. Notwithstanding any provision of law,
19 rules, or regulations to the contrary, the sum of Ninety-
20 Six Thousand Ninety-Seven Dollars (\$96,097) is hereby
21 appropriated from any available fund in the Unappropriated
22 Surplus of the Tourist Attraction Fund for the operation
23 of the Fifth South Pacific Games Commission for the period
24 commencing January 1, 1973, and ending October 31, 1975,
25 said sums to be transferred to the Guam South Pacific
26 Games Commission and to be allocated as follows:"
