AN ACT TO ADD NEW CHAPTERS X, XI, AND XII TO TITLE VII OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING THE CENTRAL ACCOUNTING OFFICE, DATA PROCESSING AND TRAINING & DEVELOPMENT WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. A new Chapter X is hereby added to Title VII

of the Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

#### "CHAPTER X

#### CENTRAL ACCOUNTING ACT

Section 6800. Title. This Chapter shall be known as the Central Accounting Act.

Section 6801. Director. The Director of Administration, hereinafter referred to as the 'Director', shall
establish and administer the central accounting office
of the Government of Guam, which will constitute the
central accounting agency for the efficient management
of a system of accounts.

section 6802. Duties of Director. The Director shall, with due regard for the function of the agencies concerned organize and operate the accounting system on a fund basis with a self-balancing set of accounts recording cash and/or other resources together with all related liabilities, obligations, reserves, and equities which are segregated for the purpose of carrying on specific activities or attaining certain objectives; establish an accounting system which provides budgetary control over general governmental revenues and expenditures; determine fairly and with full disclosure the

financial position and results of financial operations; show that all applicable legal provisions have been complied with; establish various types of funds as are necessary and as required by law; shall account in the General Fund all financial transactions not properly accounted for in another fund; shall account in the Special Revenue Funds all proceeds of specific revenue sources or to finance specified activities as required by law; shall account in the capital improvement funds all receipts and disbursements of moneys used for the acquisition of capital facilities; shall account in other funds consistent with legal and operating requirements; classify accounts to insure compliance with budgetary provisions; to provide a basis for financial and administrative control, to furnish data required for financial statements; and to provide a basis for comparison with similar data for other periods, etc.; establish standards, procedures, and techniques for a central accounting system; conduct continuing review of all accounting operations to effect improvements in accordance with current accounting practices; establish standards for the preparation of financial statements and other reports as are necessary; maintain all Federal grant award funds including maintenance of encumbrance and expenditure; and obtain reports from all departments and agencies as are required for the effective administration of a centralized accounting system.

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Section 6803. Rules and Regulations. The Director of the Department of Administration together with the Director of the Bureau of Budget and Management Research

and the Territorial Auditor subject to the approval by
the Governor of Guam shall prescribe rules and regulations
as are necessary or proper to effectuate the purposes
of this Chapter; provided, however, that the exercise
of the rule making authority herein granted shall be made
in accordance with the provisions of the Administrative
Adjudication Act. Unless otherwise found to be impracticable, such rules and regulations shall provide that the
principles of the governmental accounting and reporting,
classification of funds and accounts, and accounting
terminology shall conform to those recommended by the
National Committee on Governmental Accounting.
Section 6804. Exceptions. The provisions of this

Act shall not apply to the accounting operations of the Guam Power Authority, the Guam Telephone Authority, the Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Authority, the Guam Housing Corporation, the Guam Economic Development Authority and the Guam Transit Authority."

Section 2. A new Chapter XI is hereby added to Title VII of the Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

#### "CHAPTER XI

### AUTOMATIC DATA PROCESSING

Section 6900. Title. This Chapter shall be known as the Automatic Data Processing Act.

Section 6901. Director. The Director of Administration, hereinafter referred to as the 'Director' shall establish and administer the automatic data processing functions which will apply efficient and economical management of data.

Section 6902. Duties of Director. The Director

shall, with due regard for the functions of the agencies 1 concerned establish standards, procedures, and techniques 2 for computer systems design, analysis, programming, and 3 operations for effective utilization of resources; review 4 and prioritize sequences for implementation of systems submitted by user departments and agencies; make continuing 6 evaluations of the applicability of new technological developments; make continuing performance audit of all 8 data processing activities to assure efficient maximum 9 utilization of resources and to analyze effectiveness 10 of reports generated; evaluate hardware and software 11 requirements and analyze available hardware and software 12 13 14 15 16 17

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capabilities; solicit service needs of user departments and agencies and render assistance to them as is necessary; and to perform such other duties as are necessary and proper to the management and operations of data processing." Section 3. A new Chapter XII is hereby added to Title VII of the Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

#### "CHAPTER XII

### TRAINING AND DEVELOPMENT

Section 6910.1. Title: Purpose. This Chapter may be cited as the Training and Development Act. its purpose the objective of improving the capacity of officers and employees of the Government of Guam to perform the duties to which they have been assigned or to increase their readiness to assume broader responsibilities.

Section 6910.2. Director. The Director of Administration, hereinafter referred to as the 'Director', shall establish and administer an effective training and

development program for all government employees.

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Section 6910.3. Duties of Director. The Director, shall, with due regard for the function of the agencies concerned provide in-house training, education and developmental opportunities for job advancement for all employees; arrange and/or coordinate with educational institutions to provide continuing education; establish and administer supervisory and management development program; provide on-the-job training for various skills and trades as are necessary; seek and administer federally funded training programs; establish committees as are necessary for proper administration of all training programs; analyze all training programs to determine their usefullness and revise training procedures to meet emerging management needs; assist and coordinate all departments' and agencies needs in accordance with priorities; insure maximum utilization of training facilities; and process needs assessment study and formulate training programs to meet the needs identified in this study.

Section 6910.14. Rules and Regulations. The Director shall make such rules and regulations as are necessary or proper to effectuate the purposes of this Chapter."

Section 4. The provisions of Public Law 13-80 shall not become effective until the Boxing and Wrestling Commission established therein comes into being and begins operation.

Section 5. Sections 1, 2, and 3 of this Act shall become effective July 1, 1976. Section 4 of this Act shall be effective upon the enactment of this Act.
