Introduced by A. C. Ysrael

AN ACT TO ADD SECTION 11120 TO THE GOVERNMENT
CODE TO PROVIDE FOR EMPLOYMENT COUNSELING TO
STUDENTS IN THE PUBLIC HIGH SCHOOLS OF GUAM
AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 11120 is added to the Government

3 Code to read:

4 "Section 11120.

5 (a) On and after January 1, of every year,
6 the Board and the Director of the Department of
7 Labor shall make available to secondary students
8 continuing employment and career program counseling
9 to furnish information relating to the employment
10 opportunities available to students graduating
11 from or leaving the public high schools of Guam.

12 (b) No fee, compensation or other considera-
13 tion shall be charged to or received from any
14 student utilizing such services.

15 (c) In providing such services, the Board
16 shall consult and cooperate with the Guam Employ-
17 ment Service."

18 Section 2. A new Section 7(f) is added to Public Law
19 13-22 to read as follows:

20 "Section 7(f). Provisions of services. The
21 aforementioned services shall be provided so as to com-
22 plement or augment any and all similar services provided
23 by other civilian medical facilities on Guam; provided,

1 however, that the new Guam Memorial Hospital shall pro-
2 vide such services as the need arises, and to offer a
3 range of services which, combined with those provided by
4 the Medical Center of the Marianas, shall not exceed the
5 actual needs of the civilian community. The Board of
6 Trustees, Guam Memorial Hospital, may negotiate with
7 the Medical Center of the Marianas for the lease, lease-
8 purchase, or purchase of the acute care hospital
9 facility now under construction by said Medical Center
10 of the Marianas or negotiate agreements for provision
11 of services by said Medical Center consistent with the
12 actual need of the civilian community. Any transaction
13 so negotiated shall have no force or effect until
14 approved by the Governor and ratified by the Legislature
15 by resolution adopted by not less than 11 votes. Funds
16 appropriated under P. L. 13-22 for the purpose of public
17 hospital construction are hereby authorized for use in
18 implementing this section and for contracting any and
19 all professional services required to implement the
20 intent of this Act."

21 Section 3. Section 2 of this Act shall take effect not-
22 withstanding any other provisions of P. L. 13-22.
