AN ACT TO ADD SECTION 11120 TO THE GOVERNMENT CODE TO PROVIDE FOR EMPLOYMENT COUNSELING TO STUDENTS IN THE PUBLIC HIGH SCHOOLS OF GUAM AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:
Section 1. Section 11120 is added to the Government
Code to read:

"Section 11120.

- (a) On and after January 1, of every year, the Board and the Director of the Department of Labor shall make available to secondary students continuing employment and career program counseling to furnish information relating to the employment opportunities available to students graduating from or leaving the public high schools of Guam.
- (b) No fee, compensation or other consideration shall be charged to or received from any student utilizing such services.
- (c) In providing such services, the Board shall consult and cooperate with the Guam Employment Service."

Section 2. A new Section 7(f) is added to Public Law 13-22 to read as follows:

*Section 7(f). Provisions of services. The aforementioned services shall be provided so as to complement or augment any and all similar services provided by other civilian medical facilities on Guam; provided,

however, that the new Guam Memorial Hospital shall provide such services as the need arises, and to offer a range of services which, combined with those provided by the Medical Center of the Marianas, shall not exceed the actual needs of the civilian community. The Board of Trustees, Guam Memorial Hospital, may negotiate with the Medical Center of the Marianas for the lease, leasepurchase, or purchase of the acute care hospital facility now under construction by said Medical Center of the Marianas or negotiate agreements for provision of services by said Medical Center consistent with the actual need of the civilian community. Any transaction so negotiated shall have no force or effect until approved by the Governor and ratified by the Legislature by resolution adopted by not less than 11 votes. Funds appropriated under P. L. 13-22 for the purpose of public hospital construction are hereby authorized for use in implementing this section and for contracting any and all professional services required to implement the intent of this Act."

Section 3. Section 2 of this Act shall take effect notwithstanding any other provisions of P. L. 13-22.
