




Bill No. 473

Introduced by J. B. Underwood

AN ACT TO ADD SECTIONS 230 AND 231 TO THE  
GOVERNMENT CODE TO CREATE A COMMISSION OF  
THE METRIC SYSTEM AND TO IMPLEMENT THE  
METRIC SYSTEM IN THE TERRITORY OF GUAM.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 230 is added to the Government Code  
3 to read:

4 "Section 230. Commission on Metric System. The  
5 Governor, with the advice and consent of the Legislature,  
6 shall appoint five (5) members to the Commission on the  
7 Metric System. Commission members shall serve until  
8 December 1, 1976, at which time the Commission shall  
9 dissolve. The duties of the Commission are to conduct  
10 such studies and research as are necessary to make  
11 recommendations as to how the government of Guam can  
12 best make the transition from the current system of  
13 weights and measures to the metric system. The  
14 Commission shall submit its report to the Governor and  
15 to the Legislature no later than December 1, 1976.

16 Section 231. No later than February 1, 1977, all  
17 departments, agencies, authorities and government owned  
18 corporations shall be required to use the metric  
19 system in addition to the current system of weights  
20 and measures in all data, specifications, publications,  
21 writings, announcements, bulletins, rules, regulations  
22 or any other place in which weights and measurements  
23 are quoted."
