AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 1, CATEGORY IV AND TO ADD A NEW CATEGORY V OF PUBLIC LAW 13-1 RELATIVE TO APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF THREE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS (\$3,550) FOR THE FIRST YOUTH CONGRESS UP TO JANUARY 10, 1976.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PHOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:
Section 1. Section 1, Category IV of Public Law 13-1
is hereby amended to read as follows:

#### "Section 1.

IV. General Operations of the Thirteenth Guam Legislature:

A. For expenses of the General Operations of the Thirteenth Cuam Legislature not to exceed the total of Eight Hundred Sixty-Five Thousand Three Hundred Eight Dollars (\$865,308) to include personal services and personnel benefits of following:

(2)	Legislative Attaches	\$ 64,694
(3)	Legal Supportive Services	
	Division	\$134,230
(4)	Fiscal Services Division	\$128,206
(5)	Public Affairs Division	\$216,578

B. For expenses of the General Operations of the Thirteenth Guam Legislature, not to exceed the total of Two Hundred Ninety-Nine Thousand Dollars (\$299,000) to include travel and transportation, other contractual services, supplies and materials, equipment and miscellaneous expenses."

Section 2. A new Category V is hereby added to Section of Public Law 13-1 relative to appropriating Three Thousand Five Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$3,550) for the operation of the First Youth Congress to read as follows:

### "V. Youth Congress:

1,3

A. For the initial operation of the Youth

Congress, including salaries for the

members, not to exceed the total of Three

Thousand Five Hundred Fifty Dollars

(\$3,550.00)."

Section 3. Section 2 of Public Law 12-110 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 2. The sum of Six Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$675,000) appropriated pursuant to Section 5 of Bill No. 676, as substituted, is hereby reappropriated to the Guam Transit Authority to be used for the purposes set forth in this Act. In the event that Bill No. 676, as substituted, is not enacted into law, there is hereby appropriated from any available funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of Six Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$675,000) to be used for the purpose of purchasing transit type buses to be used as set forth in this Act.

If, at the effective date of this Act, the Board of Directors of the Guam Transit Authority is not organized, the Director of Public Works shall have the authority to carry out the purposes of this Act including, but not limited to, the purchase of transit type buses."

- ZERO - Section 4. The sum of Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars

(\$25,000) is horeby appropriated from any available surplus in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund for the operation of the Office of the Legislative Secretary to be apportioned as follows:
