12-159, SECTION 7, OF PUBLIC LAW 12-114 AND

FEDERAL EPA AND LOCAL FUNDING SHARES FOR THE

CHALAN PAGO/ORDOT, BARRIGADA AND AGANA TREAT
MENT PLANT SEWER PROJECTS AND TO APPROPRIATE

FUNDS FOR THE AGANA SNALL BOAT HARBOR.

Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law 12-159 is hereby repealed and a new Section 1 is hereby enacted to read as follows:

"Section 1. There is hereby appropriated the sum of Three Million Two Hundred Fifty-Two Thousand Three Hundred Eighty Dollars (\$3,252,380) to include One Million Two Hundred Fifty-Seven Thousand Three Hundred Eighty Dollars (\$1,257,380) of Federal Environmental Protection Agency matching funds, Two Hundred Twenty-Five Thousand (\$225,000) of Guam Rehabilitation Loan Funds and One Million Seven Hundred Seventy Thousand (\$1,770,000) from the General Funds for the Chalan Pago/Ordot Sewer System, Mangilao Sewer System and Agat-Nimitz Sewer System to be apportioned as follows:

1. For Chalan Pago/Ordot Sewer System,

Section 2. Section 7 of Public Law 12-114 is hereby repealed and a new Section 7, is hereby enacted to read as follows:

constructing the interceptor, pumping stations and collector
system to provide a sewer system for the Municipality of
Barrigada. The funds for this project are comprised of

Section 3. Section 6 of Public Law 12-205 is hereby repealed and a new Section 6 is enacted to read as follows:

"Section 6. There is hereby appropriated the sum

Hundred Fifty-Two Dollars (\$6,725,852) for the construction
of the Agana Sewage Treatment Plant. The funds for the
construction of this project are to include contributions
from the Federal Environmental Protection Agency, the Navy, and the
