AN ACT TO ADD CHAPTER IV TO TITLE LXVI OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE TO ESTABLISH AND OPERATE TERRITORIAL LOTTERY: TO PRESCRIEE POWERS AND DUTIES: TO LICENSE AND REGULATE SALES AGENTS: TO PROVIDE FOR AN APPROPRIA-TION: AND TO PROVIDE PENALTIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. A new Chapter IV is added to Title LXVI of the Government Code of Guam to read:

"CHAPTER IV

Territorial Lottery Act

Section 62300. Title. This Act shall be known and may be cited as the Territorial Lottery Act. Section 62301. Definitions.

(a) 'Commission' means the Guam GamingCommission created by Section 59000(1) of theGovernment Code.

(b) 'Executive Secretary' means the Director of the Department of Revenue and Taxation who shall serve as the executive secretary of the Commission notwithstanding his duties as ex officio Treasurer of the Guam Gaming Commission pursuant to Section 59000(1) of the Government Code.

Section 62302. Guam Gaming Commission: governing rules.

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The Guam Gaming Commission is vested with powers and duties prescribed in this Chapter and all other powers necessary and proper to enable it to execute fully and effectively all the purposes of this Chapter. A majority of the Commission shall constitute a quorum for all purposes. The Commission shall keep all records, books, accounts, receipts, special funds, and disbursements of each gaming or gambling enterprise over which it exercises control separate and distinct from each other.

Section 62302.1. Duties of the Executive Secretary. The Executive Secretary shall, in addition to his duties pursuant to Section 62306 of this Act shall keep records of the total lottery revenues, prize disbursements and other expenses of the Territorial Lottery as authorized by this Act and provide logistical support to the Commission.

Section 62303. Lottery, establishment of. The Commission shall initiate, establish and operate a territorial lottery at the earliest feasible and practicable time. The lottery shall produce the maximum amount of net revenues for the territory consonant with the general welfare of the people.

Section 62304. Lottery rules. The Commission shall promulgate rules in accordance with the Administrative Adjudication Act. The rules may include:

(a) The type of lottery to be conducted.

(b) The price of tickets or shares in the lottery.

(c) The number and size of the prizes on the winning tickets or shares.

(d) The manner of selecting the winning tickets or shares.

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(e) The manner of payment of prizes to the holders of winning tickets or shares.

(f) The frequency of the drawings or selections of winning tickets or shares.

(g) Without limit as to number of types of locations at which tickets or shares may be sold.

(h) The method to be used in selling tickets or shares, except that no person's name shall be printed on such tickets or shares.

(i) The licensing of agents to sell ticketsor shares, but a person under the age of 18 shallnot be licensed as an agent.

(j) The manner and amount of compensation to be paid licensed sales agents necessary to provide for the adequate availability of tickets or shares to prospective buyers and for the convenience of the public.

(k) The apportionment of the total annual revenues accruing from the sale of lottery tickets or shares and from all other sources for the payment of prizes to the holders of winning tickets or shares, for the payment of costs incurred in the operation and administration of the lottery, including the expenses of the bureau and the costs resulting from any contract or contracts entered into for promotional, advertising, consulting or

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operational services or for the purchase or lease of lottery equipment and materials, for the repayment of the moneys appropriated to the territorial lottery fund and for transfer to the general fund.

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Section 62305. Prize allotment. As nearly as is practicable forty-five percent (45%) of the total annual revenue accruing from the sale of lottery tickets or shares shall be apportioned for payment of prizes to the holders of winning tickets or shares. Such payments shall not require appropriation by the Legislature.

Section 62306. Reports of the Executive Secretary. The Executive Secretary shall make a monthly report to the Governor, the Treasurer of Guam and the Legislature. The monthly report shall include the total lottery revenues, prize disbursements and other expenses for the preceding month. The Executive Secretary shall make an annual report to the Governor, the treasurer of Guam and to the Legislature. The annual report shall include full and complete recommendations for changes in this Act as the Executive Secretary and the Commission deem necessary or desirable.

Section 62307. Abuse of lottery laws, rules, corrections.

(a) The Commission shall report immediately to the Governor, the treasurer of Guam and the Legislature any matter that requires immediate change in the laws of this territory in order to prevent abuses or evasions of this Act or rules promulgated hereunder or to rectify undesirable conditions in connection with the administration

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or operation of the lottery.

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(b) The Commission shall make a continuous study and investigation of the lottery:

> (1) To ascertain any defects in this Act or in the rules by reason whereof any abuses in the administration and operation of the lottery or any evasion of this Act or the rules may arise or be practiced.

(2) To formulate recommendations for changes in this Act and the rules.

(3) To guard against the use of this Act and the rules as a cloak for the carrying on of organized gambling and crime.

(4) To insure that this Act and the rules are in a form and are administered as to serve the true purposes of this Act.

(c) The Commission shall make a continuous study and investigation of the operation and the administration of similar laws which may be in effect in other states, territories, or countries, and literature on the subject which may be published or available, any federal law which may affect the operation of the lottery, and the reaction of citizens to existing and potential features of the lottery with a view to recommending or effecting changes that will tend to serve the purposes of this Act. Section 62308. Lottery, supervision of, licensing of agents. The Commission shall:

(a) Supervise and administer the operation

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of the lottery in accordance with this Act and the rules.

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(b) License as agents to sell lottery tickets such persons whom he deems will best serve the public convenience and promote the sale of tickets or shares.

Section 62309. The Commission may, subject to the applicable laws relating to public contracts, enter into contracts for the operation of the lottery, or any part thereof, and into contracts for the promotion of the lottery. A contract awarded or entered into by the Commission shall not be assigned by the holder thereof except by specific approval of the Commission. Contracts executed pursuant to this Act shall be exempt from the provisions of Section 6107 of the Government Code.

Section 62310. Commission personnel. The executive secretary shall use such personnel as necessary from the Department of Revenue and Taxation to implement this Act. The departments, boards, commissions or other governmental subdivisions of this territory shall provide assistance to the Commission upon the Commission's request.

Section 62311. Compelling of testimony and records. The superior court upon petition of the Commission after a hearing may issue subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents, papers, books, records and other evidence before it in any matter over which it has jurisdiction, control or supervision. If a person subpoenaed to attend in any such proceeding or hearing fails to obey

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the command of the subpoena without reasonable cause, or if a person in attendance in any such proceeding or hearing refuses, without lawful cause, to be examined or to answer a legal or pertinent question or to exhibit any book, account, record or other document when ordered to do so by the court may be punished as a contempt of court.

Section 62312. Licenses. (a) A license as an agent to sell lottery tickets or shares shall not be issued to any person to engage in business exclusively as a lottery sales agent. Before issuing a license the Commission shall consider factors such as the financial responsibility and security of the person and his business or activity, the accessibility of his place of business or activity to the public, the sufficiency of existing licenses to serve the public convenience and the volume of expected sales.

(b) As used in this section "person" means as individual, association, corporation, club, trust, estate, society, company, joint stock company, receiver, trustee, referee, any other person acting in a judiciary or representative capacity who is appointed by a court, or any combination or individuals. Persons includes any department, commission, agency or instrumentality of the territory, including any municipality or political subdivision and any agency or instrumentality thereof.

(c) Notwithstanding any other provision oflaw, a person licensed pursuant to this Act may

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act as a lottery sales agent. A person lawfully engaged in nongovernmental business on territory or federal property may be licenses as a lottery sales agent.

(d) A license is not assignable or transferable.

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(e) A licensed agent or his employee may sell lottery tickets or shares only on the premises stated in the license of the agent.

(f) The Commission may issue temporary license upon conditions as it deems necessary for a term which shall not extend sixty (60) days.

(g) The Commission may require a bond from any licensed agent in an amount as provided in the rules.

(h) A licensed agent shall display his license or a copy thereof conspicuously in accordance with the rules.

(i) The Commission may suspend or revoke without hearing the license of any agent who violates this Act or a rule promulgated pursuant to this Act. Section 62313. Payment of prizes. The right of any person to a prize drawn is not assignable, except that payment of any prize drawn may be paid to the estate of a deceased prize winner or to a person pursuant to an appropriate judicial order. The Commission shall be discharged of all further liability upon payment of a prize pursuant to this section.

Section 62314. Sale of tickets. (a) A person shall not sell a ticket or share at a price greater

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than that fixed by rules of the Commission. A person other than a licensed lottery sales agent shall not sell lottery tickets or shares. This section shall not be construed to prevent a person from giving lottery tickets or shares to another as a gift.

(b) A person violating this section is guilty of a misdemeanor.

Section 62315. Sale to minors prohibited. A ticket or share shall not be sold to any person under the age of eighteen (18). This does not prohibit the purchase of a ticket or share for the purpose of making a gift by a person eighteen (18) years of age or older to a person less than age eighteen (18). A licensee who knowingly sells or offers to sell a lottery ticket or share to a person under the age of eighteen (18) is guilty of a misdemeanor.

Section 62316. Forgery of tickets. Any person who, with intent to defraud, shall falsely make, alter, forge, utter, pass or counterfeit a territorial lottery ticket or share is guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment for not more than five (5) years or by a fine of not more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) or both.

Section 62317. Prizes for employees. A ticket or share shall not be purchased by and a prize shall not be paid to an officer or employee of the Commission or to any spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of abode of an officer or employee.

Section 62318. Unclaimed prizes. Unclaimed prizes money for the prize on a winning ticket or share

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shall be retained by the Commission for the person entitled thereto for one (1) year after the drawing in which was won. If a claim is not made for the money within one year, the prize money shall be deposited in the territorial lottery fund.

Section 62319. Deposit of funds. The Commission shall require that all moneys collected from the sale of lottery tickets be deposited within Guam banks, savings and loan associations and credit unions to the credit of the territory. Each deposit shall be accompanied by a report of the agent's receipts and transactions in the sale of lottery tickets and containing such information as the Commission may require. The Commission may make such arrangements for banks, savings and loan associations and credit unions to perform such functions, activities or services in connection with the operation of the lottery as it deems advisable pursuant to this Act and the rules, and the functions, activities or services shall constitute lawful functions, activities and services of banks, savings and loan associations and credit unions.

Section 62320. Sale of territorial lottery tickets not illegal. Any other law providing any penalty or disability for the sale of lottery tickets or any acts done in connection with a lottery shall not apply to the sale of tickets or shares performed pursuant to this Act.

Section 62321. Prizes for minors. If the person entitled to a prize or any winning ticket is under the age of eighteen (18) years, and the prize is more than

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One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000), the Commission shall direct payment of the prize by transfer to the guardian of the minor of a check or draft payable to the order of the guardian. If less than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000), the Commission may direct payment of the prize to the adult member of the minor's family who is legally responsible for the care and custody of the minor. The Commission shall be discharged of all further liability upon payment of a prize to a minor pursuant to this section.

Section 62322. Territorial lottery fund. A special fund to be known as the "territorial lottery fund" is created. The fund consists of all revenues received from the sale of lottery tickets or shares and all other moneys credited or transferred thereto from any other fund or source pursuant to law. Interest earnings of the territorial lottery fund shall be credited to the lottery fund.

Section 62323. Use of territorial lottery fund. The Commission is authorized to draw from the territorial lottery fund money to pay prizes won in the territorial lottery. The operations of the Commission shall be funded by appropriations of the Legislature from the territorial lottery fund. All other moneys in the territorial lottery fund shall be reserved exclusively for appropriation for (a) development of recreational and multi-purpose community facilitites and (b) creation and administration of special education facilities and (c) for agricultural development. The term 'special education' as used in this section shall mean any

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project or program designed to assist the educational process of the mentally or physically handicapped.

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Section 62324. Compensation of Commission members. Each member of the Commission shall receive the sum • of Fifty Dollars (\$50) for his attendance at any meeting of the Commission in addition to other compensation pursuant to Section 59002(3) of the Government Code and shall be reimbursed for actual travel, subsistance and out-of-pocket expenses incurred in the discharge of his responsibilities, including authorized attendance at meetings held away from Guam.

Section 62325. Audit of Commission. A certified public accountant firm appointed by the Legislature shall conduct quarterly post audits as the Legislature deems necessary. A certified public accountant firm conducting an audit under this Act shall have access and authority to examine any and all records of the Commission, its distributing agents and its licensees.

Section 62326. Severability. If any provision of this Act, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable."

Section 2. All references in Chapter 1, Title LXIV of the Government Code of Guam to Guam Greyhound Racing Commission are amended to read "Guam Gaming Commission".

Section 3. There is hereby authorized to be appropriated such sums as are necessary from the General Fund to implement

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the purposes of this Act. The Commission is authorized to submit requests for annual and supplemental appropriations as necessary pursuant to the provisions of the Executive Budget Act, Chapter III, Title VI of the Government Code of Guam.

Section 4. Notwithstanding the provisions of Chapter I, Title LXIV or any other law, rule or regulation to the contrary, an affirmative vote of 3 members of the Greyhound Racing Commission (renamed Guam Gaming Commission in Section 2 of this Act) shall be necessary to the validity of any acts of the Commission.

Section 5. This Act shall take effect thirty (30) days after the enactment of this Act.

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
