
CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR

AN ACT MAKING APPROPRIATION FOR THE YOUTH
CONSERVATION CORPS.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. There is hereby appropriated the sum of One
3 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) for the Youth Conservation
4 Corps Program in Calendar Year 1976, to include the sum of
5 Twenty Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000) from the General Fund,
6 to serve as local matching funds for Seventy Five Thousand
7 Dollars (\$75,000) in Federal Funds.

8 Section 2. The appropriation made in Section 1 shall not
9 be construed as limiting the amounts of federal monies that
10 may be received for this program; provided, however, that no
11 additional local funds may be committed to their receipt.

12 Section 3. No amount of the local portion of the
13 appropriation made in Section 1 shall be expended until such
14 time that awarding of the federal funds is certain.

15 Section 4. Subsection III, C. a. 4 and 5, IX, A. a. 7,
16 of Section 2 of Part One of Public Law 13-37 is amended as
17 follows:

18 III. Public Health

19 C. Department of Public Health and Social
20 Services

21 a. Public Health Division

22 4. For Contractual Services,

23 not to exceed \$ 251,095

24 5. For Supplies & Materials

25 not to exceed \$ 130,805

1 IX. Community Services

2 A. Department of Public Health and
3 Social Services

4 a. Social Services Division

5 7. For Miscellaneous Items, not
6 to exceed the total of
7 Three Million Five Hundred
8 Forty-One Thousand Five Hundred
9 Thirty-Five Dollars (\$3,541,535)
10 as follows:

11 For Public Assistance Grant,
12 not to exceed \$2,673,955
13 For Medicaid, not to
14 exceed \$ 861,506
15 For In-Service Training,
16 not to exceed \$ 5,364
17 For Printing of Public
18 Assistance Checks not
19 to exceed \$ 710

20 Notwithstanding any laws, rules, or regulations to the con-
21 trary, the amount of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) in
22 which the appropriation for FY 1976 is increased as identified
23 in Subsection IX.A.a.7 for Medicaid shall be used for payment
24 of Medicaid services provided to Medicaid clients during Fiscal
25 Year 1975. The combined amount of One Hundred Thousand Dollars
26 (\$100,000) reduced in Subsection III.C.a.4 and 5 is hereby
27 reappropriated to satisfy Subsection IX.A.a.7, Section 2, of
28 Public Law 13-37.

1 Section 5. There is appropriated from any available
2 surplus of the Typhoon Pamela Relief Fund (created by P. L.
3 13-145) the sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000) for the
4 purpose of assisting the farmers of Guam in restoring
5 agricultural programs.

6 Section 6. The Director of Agriculture is hereby
7 authorized to provide free of charge not to exceed Three
8 Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) per bonafide farmer who does not
9 qualify for federal assistance to credit purchases of seeds and
10 seedlings, pesticides and fertilizers.

11 Section 7. No funds may be disbursed to any farmer until
12 the Director of the Department of Agriculture certifies said
13 farmer's project as a bonafide agricultural project. All
14 unexpended funds appropriated in Section 5 of this Act shall
15 be returned to the Typhoon Pamela Relief Fund no later than
16 November 1, 1976.

17 Section 8. Part One, Section 2 I.F. 5 and 6 of Public
18 Law 13-37 are amended to read:

20 not to exceed \$129,499

21 6. For Equipment not to

22 exceed \$ 6,803
