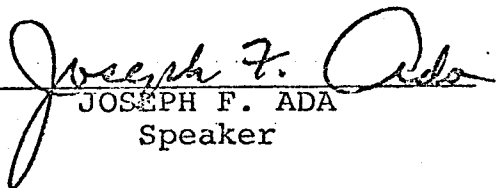

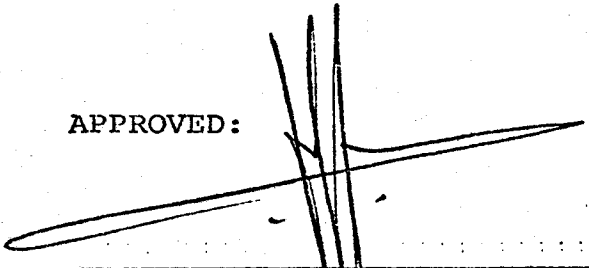

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 2254 AND SECTION
2920(e) OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE TO PROVIDE
THAT THE NAMES OF CANDIDATES SHALL APPEAR
ON BALLOTS FOR PRIMARY AND GENERAL ELECTIONS
IN AN ORDER TO BE DETERMINED BY LOT.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 2254 of the Government Code is amended
3 to read:

4 "Section 2254. Order of names on ballot. The
5 Commission shall prepare the ballot in such a manner that
6 a nominee's name shall appear under the name of the
7 political party, if any, sponsoring such nominee.

8 In all elections, the names of all nominees or
9 candidates for a specific office shall be listed in a
10 random manner. Each contestant for any office under a
11 party or independent designation shall be listed according
12 to lot drawn by the Election Commission. All drawings for
13 ballot position shall be done publicly and persons appearing
14 on the ballot shall be specifically invited to attend. The
15 drawings for ballot placement shall be accomplished as
16 soon as is reasonably possible after the identity of the
17 persons to appear on the ballot is known to the Election
18 Commission.

19 The names of the nominees shall appear in columns
20 vertically in such order as is determined by lot.

21 Columns for recognized political parties shall be
22 listed on the basis of the number of nominees elected to
23 the Legislature at the last preceding regular general

1 election in descending order from left to right; last
2 shall appear the names of those nominees not sponsored
3 by any political party, which shall appear under the
4 designation 'Independent'. The names of all
5 nominees holding the office for which they are seeking
6 election shall have the word 'Incumbent' printed
7 immediately after them."

8 Section 2. Section 2920(e) of the Government Code is
9 amended to read:

10 "(e) The remaining portion of the ballot shall be
11 divided into columns, which shall be separated by heavy
12 ruled lines, which shall be sufficient in number to
13 provide space for each political party which has quali-
14 fied for ballot placement. The political
15 parties shall be listed alphabetically from left to right.
16 The last column on the right shall be reserved for
17 the listing of independent candidates who may have quali-
18 fied for ballot placement. Each column occupied by a
19 partisan political party shall be headed by the name of
20 such party and its vignette. Under this heading shall
21 appear the title of the office being contested and the
22 names of the candidates seeking nomination thereto.
23 The order of the offices on the ballot shall be the
24 same, as near as may be, as is required by law in
25 making up the ballot used in general elections.
26 The title of the office shall be immediately above the
27 names of the candidate or candidates for the nomination
28 of such office, and under such title the words 'Vote
29 for not more than,' followed by the word 'one' or 'two'

1 or such other word as will designate the number of
2 candidates that may be voted for to complete the list
3 of nominees.

4 The names of candidates within a given column shall
5 be printed in such order as is determined by lot in
6 accordance with Section 2254 of this Code under the
7 office for which they are contesting, except that in the
8 case of the Governor and Lieutenant Governor, each
9 candidate for Governor shall be coupled with his
10 candidate for Lieutenant Governor, as established by
11 the candidate for Governor at the time of the filing
12 of his nomination papers, and there shall be only
13 one voting square next to each team of Governor and
14 Lieutenant Governor. The names of the different
15 candidates shall be separated from each other by a light
16 ruled line with a square to the left of each name.
17 The spaces devoted to the candidates for nomination
18 to different office shall be separated by a heavy ruled
19 line so as to separate each office division distinctly."

20 Section 3. Section 30502 of the Government Code of Guam
21 is hereby amended to read:

22 "Section 30502. Incorporators. A territorial bank
23 may be organized by 5 or more individual incorporators.
24 All incorporators shall be United States citizens and
25 residents of Guam. Each incorporator shall subscribe
26 and pay in full in cash for stock having a par value
27 not less than 1/2% of 1% of the minimum capital and
28 paid-in surplus requirements. Stock of a territorial
29 bank may be legally and beneficially owned only by
30 citizens of the United States, citizens of the Northern
31 Marianas or citizens of the Trust Territory of the
32 Pacific."
