




CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR





AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 1601(3) OF  
THE UNIFORM CRIMINAL EXTRADITION ACT  
TO INCLUDE WITHIN ITS COVERAGE THE  
TRUST TERRITORY OF THE PACIFIC  
ISLANDS, AND THE COMMONWEALTH OF THE  
NORTHERN MARIANAS.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 1601(3) of the Penal Code of Guam is  
3 hereby amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 1601(3). The term 'state' includes any  
5 state, territory, possession, organized or unorganized,  
6 of the United States of America, the Trust Territory of  
7 the Pacific Islands, and the 'Commonwealth of the  
8 Northern Marianas'".

9 Section 2. Section 140.12(c) of P. L. 13-186, "An Act  
10 to Establish a Criminal Procedure Code thereby consolidating  
11 and revising the law relating to the Procedure in Criminal  
12 Actions", shall be amended in like manner as provided in Section  
13 1 of this Act.
