AN ACT TO REPEAL AND REENACT CHAPTER 10, TITLE XII, OF THE COVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM RELATIVE TO THE UNIVERSITY OF GUAM AND ITS PURPOSE, GOVERNMENT, CONTROL AND OPERATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. Chapter 10, Title XII of the Government Code of Guam is hereby repealed in its entirety and in its stead a new Chapter 10 is hereby enacted as follows:

"CHAPTER 10

University of Guam

Section 11830. Establishment. There is established in the Territory of Guam a non-membership, non-profit corporation, which shall be known as the University of Guam, which is successor to the presently existing University of Guam. Section 11831. Purpose. The University of Guam shall provide instruction in the arts, sciences, professional, technical, and vocational education; it shall provide library and consultation services; it shall conduct research on any of the fields of study as its resources permit.

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Section 11832. Prohibition Against Discrimination. No student shall be denied admission to the University by reason of age, race, sex, nationality, religious belief or political affiliation.

Section 11833. Board of Regents. The government, control, and operation of the University is hereby vested in a board of regents to be known as the 'Board of Regents of the University of Guam', hereinafter referred to as the 'Board.' The Board shall be composed of seven (7) members, all citizens of the United States of America and residents of Guam for at least three (3) years, who shall be appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Legislature, for a term of four (4) years, provided, however, that the members of the existing Board of Regents of the University of Guam shall be deemed appointed to terms which will expire at the end : of their current appointments without the necessity of the advice and consent to the Legislature. In the case of a vacancy in the Board, such vacancy shall be filled by appointment by the Governor, with advice and consent of the Legislature, for the duration of the unexpired term of the office.

Section 11834. Same: Board Members Not Deemed Officers or Employees of the Government of Guam. The

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members of the Board shall not, by reason of such membership, be deemed officers or employees of the Government of Guam.

Section 11835. Same: Removal from Office. A member of the Board may be removed by a vote of four members for malfeasance in office or for persistent neglect of or inability to discharge duties, or for offenses involving moral turpitude, and for no other cause. However, no member of the Board shall be removed from office before a written bill of particulars shall have been given to the accused and before an investigation and an open hearing shall have been had. Any member who removes his residence from Guam shall be deemed to have vacated his office, thereby creating a vacancy on the Board.

Section 11836. Same: Officers. The Board shall elect a chairman, a vice-chairman, and a treasurer from its membership by a majority vote of its total membership. Section 11837. Same: Meetings. Meetings of the Board shall be held at a regular time and place as determined by the Board, but not less than once a month. Special meetings may be called by the chairman or by the call of the majority of the members, as often as may be necessary. Meetings of the Board, regular or special, shall be subject to the Open Government Law of Guam (Sections 3225-3240 of the Government Code). A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum and, unless otherwise provided herein, an affirmative vote of 4 members is required for any action to be valid. Section 11838. Same: Powers. The University of

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Guam has the power and duty to do any and all things

necessary to further the purposes of this Chapter.

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Section 11839. President of the University. The Board of Regents, by an affirmative vote of 4 members, shall appoint the President of the University, whose duties, compensation, and qualifications shall be determined by the Board. He shall be the executive head of the internal operating organization of the University; as such, he shall be responsible for the administration of the academic, business, and service activities thereof. The President of the University shall serve as Executive Secretary of the Board.

Section 11840. Officers of Administration. The University shall have such other officers of administration as may be determined by the Board.

Section 11841. Personnel Rules: Academic Personnel. Rules and regulations governing selection, promotion, performance, evaluation, demotion, suspension, and other disciplinary action affecting academic personnel shall be adopted by the Board. Such rules and regulations shall provide procedures for the employment of persons on the basis of merit, and shall include an orderly and systematic method of recruitment and the establishment of qualified lists for employment purposes.

Section 11842. Non-Academic Personnel. Notwithstanding any law, rule or regulation to the contrary, all non-academic personnel shall be classified and matters relating to employment of non-academic personnel shall be governed by and in accordance with Title V of the Government Code.

All employees of the University of Guam who have

acquired Government of Guam civil service tenure on the date of enactment of this Act and who are transferred to the corporate university in accordance with Section 11845 of this Act shall retain their tenure and status as employees of the Government of Guam.

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Section 11843. Retirement Fund. The University shall contribute to the Government of Guam Retirement Fund on the basis of annual billings as determined by the Board of Trustees, Government of Guam Retirement Fund, for the employer's share of the cost of the retirement benefits applicable to the University's employees, and their beneficiaries.

Section 11844. Workmen's Compensation Fund. 'The University shall contribute to the Workmen's Compensation Fund on the basis of annual billings as determined by the Workmen's Compensation Commissioner for the benefit payments made from such fund on account of the employees of the University.

Section 11845. University of Guam, present employees of. The University of Guam, established under this Chapter, shall be a successor to the presently existing University of Guam. All employees of the presently existing University of Guam shall be transferred to the University of Guam, a corporation established under this Chapter.

Any person accepting employment under this Section will receive not less than the straight time rate of compensation he was receiving immediately before the transfer date. The other employment benefits and rights, including retirement and leave, of such transferred employees shall be

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governed under Sections 11841, 11842, 11843, and 11844 of this Chapter.

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Section 11846. Legislative Appropriation. The Board shall submit to the Legislature a total budget requirement for each fiscal year and shall disburse such funds as the Legislature may appropriate for the purpose of carrying out the activities of the University.

Section 11847. Fiscal Authority, Accounting, and Expenditures.

(a) There is hereby established a fund to be known as the 'University of Guam Fund' which shall be maintained by the University separate and apart from other funds, and independent records and accounts shall be maintained in connection therewith.

(b) All monies received by the University, through . legislative appropriation or otherwise, shall be deposited in said 'University of Guam Fund' in eligible banks as defined in Section 6311 of the Government Code of Guam.

(c) All expenditures shall be made from said 'University of Guam Fund'.

(d) The Board shall adopt and maintain a uniform system of accounting.

(e) At the close of each fiscal year, the Board shall prepare a detailed report on the activities of the University and shall transmit copies to the Governor and to the Legislature.

(f) The Board shall prepare or cause to be prepared a detailed financial summary, the accuracy and completeness of which shall be attested to by an independent certified public accountant selected by the Legislature, pursuant

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to Section 1400 of the Government Code.

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Section 11848. Transfer of Property. There is transferred to the University of Guam title to all items of property, real or personal, now assigned to the University of Guam."

Section 2. Paragraph (d) of Section 4204, Chapter III of Title V, Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(d) An employee of a public corporation of the Government or of the University of Guam shall have the option of accepting or rejecting membership, and shall become a member only upon submission of a written request to the Board for membership."

Section 3. This Act shall be known as the Higher Education Act of 1976.

Section 4. This Act shall take effect thirty (30) days after its enactment.
