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AN ACT TO REPEAL AND REBNACT SECTIONS 11102, AND 11197; TO ADD SECTIONS 11102.1, 11102.2, 11102.3, 11102.4, 11102.5, 11102.6, 11102.7, 11102.8 AND 11102.9; TO REPEAL SECTION 11105 AND TO AMEND SECTION 11106 ALL OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE TO PROVIDE FOR AN ELECTED BOARD OF EDUCATION AND FOR OTHER PERPOSES.

BE IT BHACTED BY THE PROPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAN:
Section 1. Section 11102 of the Government Code is
repealed and reenacted to read:

"Section 11102. Board. The Board shall consist
of eleven (11) elected nembers, and three (3) non-veting
ex-officio members, all citizens of the United States
of America and residents of the Territory of Guam,
one (1) of whom shall be a youth member who shall
be a resident of the Territory of Guam, a citizen
of the United States, has passed his sixteenth birthday
and would be less than eighteen years old at the
time he is nominated. One (1) member recommended
by the Commanding Officer of the United States Air Force
personnel on Guam, one (1) member recommended by
the Commanding Officer of the United States Navy personnel

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1 on Guan and one (1) member recommended by the exclusive bargaining agent of the teachers within the department 2 3 shall be appointed by the Board to serve as non-voting em-officio members." 5 Section 2. New Sections 11102.1, 11102.2, 11102.3, 11102.4, 11102.5, 11102.6, 11102.7, 11102.8 and 11102.9 are 6 added to the Government Code to read: 7 "Section 11102.1. Same: Elected Members. 9 The members of the Board of Education shall be public 10 officers elected from the districts delineated in 11 Section 11102.2 in accordance with Title III of 12 this Code, provided that the youth member shall 13 be elected at-large and further provided that, Title III of this Code notwithstanding, candidates for 14 15 such election shall be nominated only as provided 16 in Section 11102.3. 17 18

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Section 11102.2. Same: Districts. There shall be two (2) Board members for each district for the municipalities and villages as indicated in the following table:

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- District 1. Municipality of Dededo and Municipality of Yigo.
- District 2. Municipality of Barrigada, Municipality of Mangilao and Sinajana Village.
- District 3. Village of Tamusing, Agana Reights. Mongaong Toto-Maite and the Municipality of Agama.
- District 4. Chalan Pago and Ordot, Municipality of Yona, Municipality of Talofofo, Municipality of Inerajes and

1 Municipality of Merise. 2 District 5. Municipality of Umatac, Municipality 3 of Agat, Santa Rita Village, Municipality of Piti, and Asan-Maina. 5 Section 11102.3. Same: same: nomination. 6 Homination of candidates for election to the Board 7 shall be made by petition on forms prescribed by the Election Commission and initiated by the candidate. 8 In order for a person's name to be placed on the 9 ballot for election to the Board, such petition 10 11 must be signed by not less than one hundred persons 12 registered to vote within the Territory and must be filed with the Commission not more than sixty 13 14 (60) days nor less than thirty (30) days prior to the election for such members. He defect in any 15 nominating petition presented to the Commission 16 17 shall prevent the filing of another petition which is presented within the allowed filing period. 18 19 Such petitions shall be maintained on file with the Commission for not less than ten (10) years. 20 21 Section 11102.4. Same: same: first election: terms. The members first elected shall be elected 22 23 at a special election to be held on April 16, 1977. 24 The terms of office of persons elected pursuant 25 to this section shall commence at 12 o'clock noon on the date of their certification of election by 26 the Election Commission. The person receiving the 27 28 highest number of votes in each district shall 29 serve until 12 o'clock noon on the first Monday of January 1981. The person in each district receiving 30 31 the second highest number of votes shall serve until 12 e'clock meen on the first Monday of January 1979. 32 - 3 -

The term of the youth member shall expire on the 1 first Monday of January 1979. 2 Section 11102.5. Same: same: subsequent elections: terms. After the first election, the term of office for the youth member shall be two 5 (2) years and for all other numbers the term of 6 office shall be four (4) years. Commencing with 7 the general election to be held in 1978 one (1) member shall be elected from each district 9 10 at the general election held in even-numbered years. Terms of office of such newly elected members 11 12 shall commence at 12 o'clock noon on the first Monday of January fellowing their election and shall terminate 13 14 at 12 o'clock moon on the first Monday of January 15 four (4) years thereafter. 16 Section 11102.6. Same: youth member absence 17 authorized. The youth member is authorized to absent 18 himself from any meeting when he feels his presence 19 would not be in the best interest of the Department 20 due to the nature of the subject under discussion. Section 11102.7. Membership prior to election. 21 22 The terms of Board members in office on the effective date of this Act shall terminate at 12 o'clock noon 23 24 on the date of the commencement of the terms of 25 the first elected members. 26 Section 11102.8. Same: vacancies. Vacancies 27 occurring on the Board of Education shall be filled 28 by appointment of the Governor with the consent of 29 the Legislature. 30 Section 11102.9. Should a court of competent 31 jurisdiction declare that the districting formula set out

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1 in Section 11102.2 of the Government Code as added 2 by Section 2 of this Act is unconstitutional or in conflict with the Organic Act of Guam the elected 3 4 members of the Board shall be chosen at-large until 5 such time as the Legislature shall by law provide for a districting formula which is not unconstitutional." ĸ 7 Section 3. Section 11105 of the Government Code is 8 repealed. Section 4. Saction 11106 of the Government Code is 9 amended to read: 10 17 "Section 11106. Same: Act. The concurrence 12 of six (() members of the Board shall be necessary 13 to the validity of any of its acts." Section 5. Section 11107 of the Government Code is 14 repealed and reenacted to read: 15 16 "Section 11107. Same: pay. Members shall 17 be paid the amount of Seventy-Five Dollars (\$75.00) 18 for each day on which they attend a regular, special 19 or executive meeting, not to exceed Three Hundred 20 Dollars (\$390.00) in any month, and shall be 21 reinbursed for reasonable and necessary expenses 22 incurred in the performance of their duties as 23 certified by the Treasurer of Guam." 24 Section 6. Section 15200.3 of Chapter III of Title XVI of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as 25 26 follows: "Section 15200.3. Same: election of. The 27 28 Election Commission shall conduct a general election April 16, 1977, at which the voters of each municipal 29 30 district shall elect delegates to the Convention. 31 The Public Official Financial Disclosure Act 32 (Government Code of Guam Sections 1800-1805) shall

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not apply to delegate candidates. The Election Code 1 2 and regulations promulgated thereunder shall apply 3 with the following exceptione: (1) The election shall be non-partisan. (No political party directly or indirectly shall 5 sponsor, nominate, or endorse any of the candidates for the general election of delegates established 7 8 by this Chapter). No primary election shall be conducted. (3) The Election Commission may elect to forego 10 11 mechanical tabulation in favor of determining the official final results by a means of manual tabulation. 12 13 Procedures regarding any such manual tabulation "清不清意" 14 shall be duly promulgated by Election Commission 15 rules and regulations. 16 Sections 2300 through 2304 and Sections 2306 through 2320 of the Government Code of Guam 17 (Guam Election Code) need not be complied with." 18 Section 7. Section 15200.15 of Chapter III of Title 19 XVI of the Government Code of Guan is hereby anended to read 20 21 as follows: "Section 15200.15. Rules and Regulations. 22 The Election Commission shall promulgate the mecessary 23 24 rules and regulations to conduct the referendum 25 and implement its purpose. By such rules and re-gulations, the Election Commission may elect to forego 26 27 mechanical tabulation and establish a procedure for 28 final, official manual tabulation of the referendum 29 Votes. 30 Upon the approval by not less than a majority 31 of the voters (counting only the affirmative or negative 32 votes) participating in such referendum, the Constitution - 6 -

shall become effective in accordance with its terms."

Section 8. Section 4 of Public Law 13-202 is hereby
amended to read as follows:

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"Section 4. The sum of Seventy-Six Thousand
Dollars (\$76,000.00) is appropriated from any available
funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General
Fund to the Election Commission for the purpose of
conducting the election for delegates to the Convention
and for the purpose of conducting the referendum."

Section 9. Referendum. A referendum shall be submitted to the people at the election to be held on April 16, 1977 so that the people may express their will concerning various important questions.

Section 10. Rules, regulations, form and sontent. The Election Commission shall implement this Act and if necessary, promulgate rules and regulations to effectuate the purposes of this Act. The approval of any question on the referendam shall require a plurality of the votes cast thereon. The form of and the questions contained in the referendam shall be as follows:

Section 11. The Election Commission shall within thirty (30) days after the referendum publish the results of said referendum.

Section 12. There is hereby appropriated the sum of Forty-Two Thousand Dollars (\$42,000.00) from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund to the Election Commission for the purposes of Sections 1, 2, 9, 10 and 11 of this Act.
