AN ACT AMENDING SECTION 91 OF THE CODE OF CIVIL PROCEDURE RELATIVE TO THE TERM FOR JUDGES OF THE SUPERIOR COURT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:
Section 1. Section 91 of the Code of Civil Procedure is
hereby amended as follows:

"Section 91. Tenure; declarations of candidacy; form of judicial ballot; rejection and retention. Each judge or justice shall hold office for a term ending January 30th following the next general election after the expiration of seven (7) years since his appointment or election to office. No less than sixty (60) days prior to the holding of the general election next preceding the expiration of his term of office, any judge or justice may file in the office of the Election Commission a declaration of candidacy for election to succeed himself. If a declaration is not filed, the vacancy resulting from the expiration of his term of office shall be filled by appointment pursuant to Section 90. If such a declaration is filed, his name shall be submitted at said next general election on a separate judicial ballot, without party designation reading:
