


CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR



AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE
OPERATION OF THE FOURTEENTH GUAM LEGIS-
LATURE FOR THE CALENDAR YEAR ENDING
DECEMBER 31, 1977, AND FOR OTHER
PURPOSES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. The sum of Two Million Nine Hundred Fifty
3 Thousand Dollars (\$2,950,000.00) is appropriated from any
4 available surplus in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General
5 Fund to the Legislative Operations Fund for the operation of
6 the Fourteenth Guam Legislature for the calendar year ending
7 December 31, 1977, to be utilized in the following categories:

8 "I. For thirteen (13) Senators
9 to include Salaries and
10 Personal Benefits, not to
11 exceed \$276,931.00

12 II. For the expenses of the
13 Standing Committees of
14 the Fourteenth Guam Legis-
15 lature, to include personal
16 services, personnel bene-
17 fits, travel and trans-
18 portation, other contractual
19 services, supplies and
20 materials, equipment and
21 miscellaneous expenses, not
22 to exceed One Million Fifty-
23 Three Thousand Dollars

11 III. For the expenses of the opera-
 12 tion of the Office of the
 13 Minority, to include but not
 14 limited to personal services,
 15 personnel benefits, travel and
 16 transportation, other contractual
 17 services, supplies and materials,
 18 equipment, and miscellaneous
 19 expenses, not to exceed the total
 20 of Seven Hundred Thousand
 21 Dollars (\$700,000.00) to
 22 be utilized in the following
 23 categories:

- 24 A. For eight (8) Senators to
- 25 include salaries and personal
- 26 benefits, not to exceed \$171,579.00
- 27 B. For the operation of the
- 28 Minority Offices not to
- 29 exceed \$528,429.00

1 IV. General Operations of the
2 Fourteenth Guam Legislature:

3 A. For expenses of the General
4 Operations, to include
5 personal services, personnel
6 benefits, travel and trans-
7 portation, other contractual
8 services, supplies and
9 materials, equipment, and
10 miscellaneous and contingent
11 expenses, not to exceed \$920,069.00"

12 Section 2. Notwithstanding any law, rule, or regulation
13 to the contrary those employees of the Thirteenth Guam Legis-
14 lature who did not receive lump sum payment for accumulated
15 annual leave and who are now employed by the Fourteenth Guam
16 Legislature shall be allowed to carry over such annual leave to
17 their period of employment in the Fourteenth Guam Legislature.

18 Section 3. Section 1 of Public Law 13-205 is hereby
19 repealed. All expenditures charged against the appropriation
20 made by Section 1 of Public Law 13-205 shall be transferred and
21 charged to the appropriation made by this Act.

22 Section 4. Section 11102.1 of the Government Code is
23 amended to read:

24 "Section 11102.1. Same: Elected Members. The members
25 of the Board of Education shall be public officers elected
26 from the districts delineated in Section 11102.2 in accor-
27 dance with Title III of this Code, provided that the youth
28 member shall be elected at-large and further provided that
29 Title III of this Code notwithstanding, candidates for
30 such election shall be nominated only as provided in
31 Section 11102.3. The elections provided for in this Act
32 shall be nonpartisan. No political party shall directly or
33 indirectly sponsor, nominate or endorse any of the candi-
34 dates for office."
