AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE DEDICATION OF LAND FOR CONSTRUCTION OF A BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA HEADQUARTERS AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. The Governor of Guam is hereby authorized to dedicate government owned real property not to exceed 40,000 square feet to the Boy Scouts of America, Aloha Council, Chamorro District for the construction of a headquarters building. Said dedication shall provide if any of the property dedicated shall not be used and maintained for the aforesaid purpose, or if any part shall cease to be used and maintained for such purpose, or if any part shall be used for any other purpose inconsistent with such purpose, then all right, title, and interest in and to the property and to the improvements thereon, shall revert to and revest in dedicator, government of Guam.

Section 2. This Act shall be effective upon the enactment of this measure.

Section 3. Section 1209 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby repealed and a new Section 1209 is hereby enacted to read as follows:

"Section 1209. Witness: Privilege. No person sworn and examined before the Legislature, or a committee, shall be immune from criminal prosecution by reason thereof, nor shall any document or thing produced by such witness be excluded by reason of such production from use in any subsequent criminal

proceeding; provided, however, that the Legislature 1 or committee may, by majority vote of all its members, 2 grant immunity to such witness who shall thereafter 3 be compelled to testify on penalty of contempt. No witness so compelled shall be held to answer criminally or be subject to any penalty or forfeiture for any fact or act touching which he is required to testify, 7 nor shall any document or thing produced by such 8 9 witness be competent evidence in any criminal proceeding against the witness. Nothing in this Section exempts 10 any witness from prosecution and punishment for perjuty 11 12 committed by him on examination."
