

CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR





AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION  
FOR THE OPERATION OF YOUTH WEEK  
1977 AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. There is hereby appropriated from the  
3 Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of Ten  
4 Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) for the operation of Youth Week 1977.

5 Section 2. All proceeds collected from activities during  
6 Youth Week 1977 may be expended for the operation of Youth  
7 Week 1977.

8 Section 3. The Youth Bureau of the Governor's Office shall  
9 have purview over the disbursement of funds, maintaining of records,  
10 administering revenues, providing manpower as needed, insuring  
11 the compliance of the report due date, and other logistical  
12 support as needed.

13 Section 4. The certifying officer shall be the Director of  
14 the Bureau of Budget and Management Research or his designate.

15 Section 5. Any nonexpendable items purchased with funds  
16 under Section 1 of this Act shall be stored or used by the  
17 Department of Parks & Recreation for use in the ensuing Youth  
18 Week.

19 Section 6. The Central Planning Committee will submit to  
20 the Legislature, the Youth Congress, the Governor of Guam, the  
21 Chief Justice of the Judiciary Branch, the Bureau of Budget and  
22 Management Research, the District Commissioners, Assistant  
23 Commissioners, and the principals of the participating schools,  
24 a full report of the Youth Week activities, including a detailed

1 analysis of all income and expenditures, on or before June 1,  
2 1977.

3 Section 7. All unexpended amounts existing as of May 31,  
4 1977 from the appropriation made in Section 1 of this Act is  
5 hereby returned to the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund.

6 Section 8. All unexpended amounts from the appropriation  
7 made in P.L. 13-141 is hereby returned to the Unappropriated  
8 Surplus of the General Fund.

9 Section 9. The appropriations made by Section 1 of Public  
10 Law 13-149 for the following agencies are hereby reduced by the  
11 amounts appearing opposite the items below and are reverted to  
12 the General Fund to finance the appropriations made by Section  
13 10 of this Act:

4 Section 11. The sum of Twenty-Seven Thousand Four Hundred  
5 Forty-Five Dollars (\$27,445) appropriated under Section 10 of  
6 this Act for the Customs and Quarantine Division of the Department  
7 of Commerce shall consist entirely of Federal Grants from the Law  
8 Enforcement Assistance Administration (LEAA). In the event that  
9 this grant is not received in its entirety, the amount authorized  
10 herein for expenditure shall be reduced correspondingly. In no  
11 event shall local revenues be expended in lieu of federal grants.

12 Section 12. The appropriation made by Section 1 of Public  
13 Law 13-149 for salary increments for the Department of Education  
14 is hereby authorized to be expended for reclassification and  
15 salary increments retroactive to April 25, 1975 due the public  
16 school teachers of Guam pursuant to the Board-Union contract. No  
17 sum appropriated by Public Law 13-149, however, may be expended  
18 to fund salary increases resulting from reassignment of pay ranges  
19 not authorized in the budget.

20 Section 13. The sum of One Hundred and Four Thousand Dollars  
21 (\$104,000) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the  
22 Guam Environmental Protection Agency for the implementation of  
23 Resolution No. 384 relative to the Water Resources Planning for  
24 Guam. Said sums shall include Fifty-Two Thousand Dollars (\$52,000)  
25 Federal Grants-In-Aid from the Water Resources Council. Any  
26 balance remaining as of September 30, 1979 from the appropriation  
27 made in this Section is hereby returned to the General Fund.

28 Section 14. The sum of Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000) is  
29 hereby appropriated from any available funds in the General Fund  
30 to the Public Utility Agency of Guam for the purpose of procuring  
31 and installing water pipes at the Dededo agricultural tract known  
32 as Ukudu, As-tumbo, Dededo.

1 . Section 15. Any unexpended balance of the funds transferred  
2 to the Legislature's Operation Fund by Section 5 of Public Law  
3 12-23 is hereby transferred to the Subcommittee on Federal-  
4 Territorial Relations of the Committee on Territorial Federal  
5 Affairs to be used by that subcommittee only for the purpose of  
6 defraying the cost of a briefing paper to be made to the delegates  
7 to the forthcoming Constitutional Convention.
