

AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR SUMMER  
YOUTH EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. There is hereby appropriated from the General  
3 Fund the sum of Ninety-One Thousand Eight Hundred Seventy-Five  
4 Dollars (\$91,875) to the Department of Labor for the purpose of  
5 initiating and administering a Summer Youth Employment Program  
6 subject to the conditions expressed herein:

7 (a) Employment of youths shall be in any duly licensed  
8 or registered firm, performing outside the scope of govern-  
9 ment work, and same business shall comply with all fair  
10 labor laws existing in and for the territory of Guam.

11 Furthermore, no employer shall claim for reimbursement the  
12 work of student employees normally employed during the year,  
13 as shall be determined by the Director of Labor or his  
14 appointed delegate.

1           (d) The Chairman of the Committee on Youth & Senior  
2 Citizens is authorized to expend not more than five percent  
3 (5%) of the appropriation made above to cover administrative  
4 expenses.

5           (e) The Chairman of the Committee on Youth and Senior  
6 Citizens shall establish such procedures, rules and regula-  
7 tions to assure success of the program, not inconsistent with  
8 the conditions prescribed above.

9           Section 6. The Chairman of the Committee on Youth and Senior  
10 Citizens shall submit a report to the Legislature not later than  
11 September 16, 1977, which shall include, but not be limited to a  
12 detailed statement of expenditures, the extent to which the above  
13 conditions have been complied with, a review and evaluation of  
14 the program and such recommendations for improving the program  
15 as may be warranted.

16           Section 7. All unexpended balances from the appropriations  
17 made in Sections 1, 3, and 5 of this Act existing as of September  
18 1, 1977 are hereby returned to the General Fund.

19           Section 8. This Act shall take effect immediately.

1 (b) Persons aged 15-19, as of June 13, 1977 shall be  
2 eligible for employment, provided however that they are cur-  
3 rently enrolled in school or have just completed one full  
4 academic year prior to the period of employment.

5 (c) The government of Guam shall reimburse to partici-  
6 pating employers, at a procedure to be established by the  
7 Director of Labor or his delegate, the sum of One Dollar  
8 (\$1.00) per hour per employee, provided however that  
9 reimbursement will not be provided for work in excess of  
10 thirty-five (35) hours per week per employee, and that  
11 reimbursement shall cover work performed in the period June  
12 13 through August 20.

13 (d) The Director of Labor is authorized to expend not  
14 more than five percent (5%) of this appropriation for  
15 administrative expenses.

16 (e) The Director of Labor shall establish such pro-  
17 cedures, rules and regulations as is necessary to assure  
18 success of this program, not inconsistent with the conditions  
19 prescribed above.

20 Section 2. The Director of Labor shall submit a report to  
21 the Legislature not later than September 16, 1977 which shall  
22 include, but not be limited to, a detailed statement of expen-  
23 ditures, the extent of compliance with the conditions outlined in  
24 Section 1, review and evaluation of the Summer Employment Program  
25 and such recommendations for improving the program as may be  
26 warranted.

27 Section 3. There is hereby appropriated from the General  
28 Fund the sum of Seventy-Three Thousand Nine Hundred Twenty-Six  
29 Dollars (\$73,926) to the Governor's Youth Bureau for purposes  
30 of initiating and administering a Summer Youth Employment Program,  
31 subject to the conditions expressed herein:

1           (a) Employment of youths shall be within a department  
2 or agency of the executive branch, excluding the Governor's  
3 Office, which can provide healthy outdoor work to the  
4 student to enhance the aesthetic beauty of the island or  
5 is able to aid the student employee in developing a working  
6 skill.

7           (b) Any person aged 15-19, as of June 13, 1977 shall  
8 be eligible for employment, provided however, that he/she  
9 has graduated from high school or is currently enrolled  
10 in junior or senior school or has not completed one full  
11 academic year prior to the period of employment.

12           (c) The Government of Guam shall pay student employees  
13 enrolled in this program the sum of Two Dollars and Thirty-  
14 Five Cents (\$2.35) per hour, provided however that work for  
15 which payment is made (1) shall not exceed Thirty-Five (35)  
16 hours per week per employee and (2) is performed between  
17 June 13 and August 5, 1977. Furthermore, notwithstanding any  
18 other provision of law, student employees shall not be  
19 members of the Government of Guam Retirement Fund.

20           (d) The Governor's Youth Bureau is authorized to expend  
21 not more than five percent (5%) of the above appropriation  
22 for administrative expenses.

23           (e) The Youth Bureau shall establish such procedures,  
24 rules and regulations as is necessary to successfully  
25 implement this program, not inconsistent with the conditions  
26 prescribed above.

1           Section 4. The Youth Bureau shall submit a report to the  
2           Legislature not later than September 16, 1977 which shall include,  
3           but not be limited to, a detailed statement of expenditures,  
4           the extent of compliance with the conditions outlined in Section  
5           3, a review and evaluation of the Summer Employment Program under  
6           their sponsorship and such recommendations for improving the  
7           program as may be warranted.

8           Section 5. There ~~is~~ hereby appropriated from the General  
9           Fund the sum of ~~Fifty-Seven Thousand Five Hundred Ten Dollars~~  
10           ~~(\$57,510)~~ <sup>ZERO</sup> to the Fourteenth Guam Legislature's Committee on Youth  
11           & Senior Citizens for the purpose of initiating and administering  
12           a Summer Youth Employment Program, subject to the conditions  
13           expressed herein:

14           (a) Employment of youth shall be within the three  
15           branches of the government of Guam. Employment of eligible  
16           youths shall be as much as possible within a branch depart-  
17           ment, agency or division thereof where the student can be  
18           introduced to work complementary to his/her major area of  
19           study.

20           (b) All persons aged 18 or older as of June 13, 1977  
21           shall be eligible for employment, provided however, that  
22           they are currently registered in a recognized college  
23           or university, and must have completed at least one full  
24           academic school year.

25           (c) The government of Guam shall pay the students  
26           employed under this program the sum of Three Dollars and  
27           Twenty-Five Cents (\$3.25) per hour, provided however that  
28           work for which compensation shall be paid does not exceed  
29           thirty-five (35) hours per week per employee and that such  
30           work is provided during the period June 13 through August  
31           12, 1977. Student employees shall not be members of the  
32           Government of Guam Retirement Fund.
