

AN ACT TO ADD A NEW SECTION 4104.1, OF THE
GOVERNMENT CODE TO PROVIDE A PAY INCREASE FOR
THOSE EMPLOYEES WHO HAVE BEEN AT STEP 10 OF THE
PAY RANGES FOR THREE YEARS AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. A new Section 4104.1 is added to the Government
3 Code to read:

4 "Section 4104.1. The rules and regulations referred to
5 in Section 4104 shall provide that an employee who is at
6 step 10 for three (3) consecutive years and has served
7 satisfactorily shall have his work record reviewed and if it
8 is found to be satisfactory, then he shall have his pay
9 adjusted to Step 10 in the next highest pay range."

10 Section 2. A new Section 4106.2 is added to the Government
11 Code of Guam to read:

12 "Section 4106.2. Within the Department of Public Health
13 and Social Services the following classified positions are
14 created and given annual compensation as follows:

<u>POSITION</u>	<u>SALARY</u>
General Practitioner	\$28,000 - \$31,000
Physician Specialist (Board eligible)	\$32,000 - \$35,000
Physician Specialist (Board approved)	\$36,000 - \$39,000."

1 Section 3. Persons who on June 30, 1977 had contracts with
2 the Department of Public Health and Social Services for provision
3 of professional medical services may be employed by the Department
4 in regular positions without complying with statutory provisions,
5 rules or regulations relating to appointment of employees. In
6 carrying out the Administrative Provisions of Public Law 14-43 it
7 is the clear intention of the Legislature to authorize the filling
8 of positions which contribute to the health or safety of Guam
9 residents and other positions which are essential or otherwise
10 critical to the operation of the government. It is the simple
11 intention of Item IV.G of Part III of Public Law 14-43 to dis-
12 continue the practice of using special contracts and consultant
13 contracts to fill regular positions in government of Guam service
14 and to require instead that the merit system and the personnel
15 laws be fully implemented.

16 Section 4. Sections 2 and 3 of this Act are retroactive in
17 its effect to July 1, 1977.

18 Section 5. Section 2 of Public Law 10-195, as amended by
19 Public Law 14-41, is hereby amended to read as follows:

20 "Section 2. Notwithstanding any other provision of
21 law (including the provision of Chapter 6, Title XIV of
22 the Government Code of Guam) with respect to the sale of
23 government land, the Governor is authorized to sell lots
24 in the Pagachao Subdivision in Agat, Pigua Subdivision in
25 Merizo, and the Umatac Subdivision in Umatac at less than
26 fair market value of the lots and at less than the cost
27 expended by the government of Guam in developing and im-
28 proving said lots, but not to exceed the amount of Two
29 Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500) for each lot."

Section 6. (a) Part I, Section 1, VIII., A., 2., of Public Law 14-43 is amended to read:

"2. Parks Division

a. Personal Services	\$365,648
b. Personnel Benefits	\$ 45,382
c. Contractual Services	\$ 22,500
d. Supplies & Materials	\$ 22,821
e. Equipment	\$ 3,859

(b) Part I, Section 1, VIII., A., 3., of Public Law 14-43 is amended to read:

3. Recreation Division

a. Personal Services	\$309,418
b. Personnel Benefits	\$ 33,624
c. Contractual Services	\$ 19,400
d. Supplies & Materials	\$ 27,067
e. Equipment	\$ 11,560

(c) The transfer of appropriation made in this Section shall be for the purpose of restoring to the Recreation Division the position, Parks and Recreation Coordinator (#P-749) and delineating the position, Parks and Maintenance Foreman in the Parks Division."

Section 7. There is hereby added a new Subsection (c) to Section 11101 of the Government Code to read:

"(c) The Department of Education may employ an attorney to assist and represent it in all civil matters which concern the Department. The Attorney General shall represent the Department in all litigation in which the Department is interested, provided that the Attorney General shall designate the Attorney for the Department as a Special Assistant Attorney General for this purpose.

1 The Department of Education may set the terms and con-
2 ditions of employment for the Attorney, his compensation and
3 whether he be appointed as a full-time employee, an indepen-
4 dent consultant, or may utilize the services of a law firm.

5 The attorney so employed, or engaged, shall be admitted
6 to practice before the courts of Guam under the same condi-
7 tions as are attorneys employed by the government pursuant
8 to Section 28002.2 of the Government Code."

9 Section 8. The attorney holding the position authorized
10 in Section 11101 (c) of the Government Code shall be compensated
11 entirely from Federal funds for fiscal year ending June 30, 1978.

12 Section 9. Notwithstanding any provisions of law, rules or
13 regulations to the contrary, balances available on June 30, 1977 of
14 Federal Grants-in-Aid and their required local matching share
15 appropriated under Public Law 13-149 are hereby reappropriated for
16 the same purposes and objects and to be carried forward past
17 June 30, 1977, the closing date of the fiscal year for government
18 of Guam, to September 30, 1977, the closing date of the fiscal
19 year for the Federal government. Provided further that this
20 Section shall not be construed as an additional appropriation.
