AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 21604, 21605 AND 21612 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE RELATIVE TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE GUAM TELEPHONE AUTHORITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. Section 21604 of the Government Code is amended to read:

"Section 21604. Board of Directors. (a) All powers vested in the Authority except as provided herein shall be exercised by the Board. The Board shall consist of seven (7) Directors, nominated and appointed by the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Legislature. The five (5) Directors first appointed shall classify themselves by lot so that their terms shall expire respectively as follows: June 30, 1974, June 30, 1975, June 30, 1976, June 30, 1977, and June 30, 1978. The terms of the two (2) Directors appointed in accordance with the provisions of this Act shall expire on June 30, 1979, and June 30, 1980 with the Governor to designate which term applied to which Director. Their successors shall be appointed each for a term of five (5) years from the date of the expiration of the term for which his predecessor was appointed and until his successor is appointed and has qualified. All vacancies occurring in the office of Directors shall be filled by the

Except for those Directors serving on the effective date hereof no person shall be appointed to the position of Director unless he shall be a resident of Guam for at least one (1) year prior to his appointment. In making appointments to the Board the Governor shall endeavor to select at least one (1) member who would be representative of the consuming public and who might be referred to as 'man-on-the-street' type.

(b) Four (4) Directors shall constitute a quorum of the Board for the transaction of all business. The Board may adopt rules and regulations governing the conduct of its affairs. It shall elect a Chairman and a Vice Chairman from among the Directors.

The Board shall be responsible for setting general policies of the Authority. The daily operations of the Authority shall be the province of the General Manager. The concurrence by resolution of four (4) Directors at a properly called and noticed meeting of the Board held within Guam shall be necessary for the validity of any act of the Board. The Board shall act only by resolution at such a meeting and no individual member or group of members shall have any authority to direct any employee of the Authority except by a resolution adopted as herein provided.

(c) Each Director shall receive the sum of Fifty
Dollars (\$50.00) for each attendance at the public meetings
of the Board, but such compensation shall not apply to more
than two (2) meetings in any one (1) calendar month. No
Director shall receive any other compensation, but shall be
reimbursed for actual travel, subsistence and out-of-pecket
expenses incurred in the discharge of his responsibilities.

The Board shall adopt policies clearly delineating 1 the respective duties and responsibilities of the Board 2 and the Manager and may delegate to the Manager additional 3 powers not prescribed by Section 21605, shall exercise its 4 5 authority only when acting as a Board at properly called meetings and no individual Board member shall attempt to 6 make commitments on behalf of the Authority or to give any 7 8 directions to individual employees of the Authority." 9 Section 2. Section 21605 of the Government Code is amended to read: 10 "Section 21605. General Manager. (a) The Board shall 11 appoint and fix the compensation of a General Manager who 12 13 shall be its chief executive officer and who shall serve at its pleasure or for the term and under the conditions set 14 forth in a contract. 15 16 (b) The powers of the General Manager include the 17 following: (i) To see that all rules and regulations of 18 19 the Authority are enforced. 20 (ii) To attend all meetings of the Board and submit a general report of the affairs of the Authority. 21 (iii) To keep the Board advised as to the needs of 22 23 the Authority and to approve demands for the payment of obligations of the Authority within the purposes and 24 25 amounts authorized by the Board. (iv) To prepare or cause to be prepared all plans 26 27 and specifications for the construction of the works 28 of the Authority, to select a list of qualified bidders 29 and to submit to the Board a recommendation for approval 30 of the successful bidder. 3

1 (v) To conduct, under the policies set by the 2 Board, negotiations with governmental or private 3 organizations concerning the business of the Authority 4 and to submit appropriate recommendations to the Board. 5 (vi) To devote his entire time to the business of 6 the Authority; to select and appoint the employees of 7 the Authority, except as otherwise provided by this 8 Act; and to plan, organize, coordinate and control the 9 services of such employees in the exercise of the powers of the Authority under the general direction of 10 the Board. 11 (vii) To cause to be published within one hundred 12 13 twenty (120) days from the end of each fiscal year a financial report showing the result of operations for 14 15 the preceding fiscal year and the financial status of 16 the Authority on the last day thereof. The publication 17 shall be made in the manner provided by the Board. 18 (viii) To prepare or cause to be prepared all reports 19 required by the Rural Electrification Administration, 20 or its successor, and comply with the Administration's regulations and directives with respect to the con-21 22 struction and operation of the system. 23 (ix) To perform such other and additional duties 24 as the Board may require. (c) The Board may contract with a corporation to per-25 26 form any or all of the duties and to exercise any or all of 27 the powers of the General Manager as provided in this Section, 28 and the General Manager, subject to the approval of the Board, may contract with a corporation to perform some of 29 30 the duties or to render expert and technical assistance in 31 the operation of the Authority."

Section 3. Section 21612 of the Government Code is amended to read:

"Section 21612. Employment. (a) Pursuant to the provisions of Section 4004 of this Code, the Board shall establish rules and regulations governing selection, promotion, performance evaluation, demotion, suspension, and other disciplinary action for the employees of the Authority.

- (b) Employees of the Authority, excluding the Directers, shall be members of the Government of Guam Retirement Fund, subject to the provisions of Section 4294 of this Code, except that for the purposes of Subsection (a) of said Section, the employees of the Authority shall not be considered employees of a 'public corporation' whereby their membership in the Fund is optional and membership therein must be specifically requested. The Authority shall contribute to the Government of Guam Retirement Fund on the basis of annual billings as determined by the Board of Trustees, Government of Guam Retirement Pund, for the government share of the cost of the retirement benefits applicable to the Authority's employees and their beneficiaries. The Authority shall also contribute to the Workmen's Compensation Fund, on the basis of annual billings as determined by the Workmen's Compensation Commissioner, for the benefit payments made from such Fund on account of the Authority's employees.
- Notwithstanding any provisions of law, neither the manager, secretary, treasurer, comptroller, nor attorney of the Authority shall be within the classified service of the government of Guam but shall be hired, compensated and employed under terms and conditions fixed by, and at the pleasure of the Board.

(d) This Act shall be administered entirely on a nonpartisan basis, and in the appointment of officials, the
selection of employees, and in the promotion of any such
officials or employees, all such appointments and promotions
shall be given or made only on the basis of merit and
efficiency."

Section 4. Implementation and Effective Date. All rules, regulations and appointments of the Board in conflict with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed. This Act shall become effective upon enactment into law.
