AN ACT TO ADD CHAPTER V-B TO TITLE XII; REPEAL SECTIONS 11406, 11407, 11409 AND 11410; AMEND SECTION 11408 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE AND TO AMEND SECTION 252 OF THE CODE OF CIVIL PROCEDURE TO DEFINE PUPIL TRUANCY AND TO PROVIDE FOR SUSPENSION AND EXPULSION OF PUPILS AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. A new Chapter V-B is added to Title XII of the Government Code to read:

"CHAPTER V-B

Pupil Truancy, Suspension and Expulsion

Section 11460. Definitions. As used in this
Chapter:

- (1) 'Board' means the Board of Education.
- (2) 'Parent' means the parent, guardian or other person who has the custody or responsibility for the care of a child.
- (3) 'Truant' means a pupil found to be absent from school without a reasonable and bona fide excuse from a parent for more than three (3) days during any school year.

Section 11461. Habitual Truant. A pupil is an habitual truant if he has been reported as a truant three or more times. If any pupil is an habitual truant, the principal of his school shall request the Director to file a petition concerning such habitual truant in the Juvenile Court of Guam.

Section 11462. Attendance Officer. The Director shall appoint an employee of the Department of Education (the 'Department') as attendance officer. attendance officer, any peace officer or principal may take into custody during school hours, without warrant, any truant found away from his home and who has been reported truant.

Section 11463. Same: Delivery of Truant. attendance officer upon taking a truant into custody, shall deliver him promptly either to his parent or to the school from which the pupil attends. If the child is an habitual truant, the attendance officer, with the concurrence of the principal of the pupil's school, shall bring the child before the Juvenile Court.

Section 11464. Same: Disposition. The attendance officer shall promptly report to the Department and to the parent the disposition made by him of the truant.

Section 11465. Report to Court and Social Services. Any pupil who has once been adjudged an habitual truant or who is again reported as a truant one or more days or is late to school for thirty or more minutes on one or more days without excuse, shall be reported by the Director or the attendance officer to the Juvenile Court and to the Division of Social Services of the Department of Public Health and Social Services.

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Section 11466. Court Hearing. If the Court after hearing, finds that the allegations of habitual truancy are sustained by evidence, it may order that the child be detained and maintained in a school supervised by the Court for the remainder of the current school term, or it may order that the child be turned over to the custody of the Division of Social Services where he shall be provided casework treatment and services.

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Section 11467. Submission of Report. The attendance officer shall report monthly to the Director the number and types of reports and requests made by each school in Guam pursuant to this Chapter and whether each school within Guam has complied with the provisions of this Chapter.

Expulsion of Pupil. The Board shall determine by regulation the grounds for suspension or expulsion of pupils from school and the procedure whereby such suspension or expulsion is determined. Such regulation shall include grounds for suspensions or expulsions, length of suspensions, and the procedures for review of suspension or expulsion orders. In adopting the regulation establishing procedures for suspending or expelling pupils, the Board shall follow the guidelines established therefor by the Supreme Court of the United States. Such hearings and procedures as are established by the Board pursuant to this Chapter shall provide any pupil against whom suspension or expulsion procedures are initiated with due process of law. Such procedures

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are exempt from the provisions of Chapter II of Title
XXV (the Administrative Adjudication Act) of this Code.

Section 11469. Student Discipline Advisory

Councils. In carrying out the provision of Section 11468
the Board may authorize the creation of a Student

Discipline Advisory Council for each elementary and
secondary school. Such Councils shall be given the power
to establish standards of student behavior and shall have
authority to hear charges of violation of such standards
and to recommend appropriate disciplinary action to
the principal. The procedure for expelling pupils shall
require that before expulsion, the accused pupil be
given a hearing before the Student Discipline Advisory
Council of his school, if such exists."

Section 2. Item (5) is added to Subsection (a) of Section 252 of the Code of Civil Procedure to read:

"(5) A 'truant' as defined in Section 11461 (3) of the Government Code."

Section 3. Sections 11405, 11407, 11409 and 11410 of the Government Code are repealed.

Section 4. Section 11408 of the Government Code is amended to read:

"Section 11408. Liability for Injury to Property.

The parent or guardian of any pupil who wilfully cuts, defaces, or otherwise injures in any way any property, real or personal, belonging to a school, shall be liable for all damages so caused by the pupil. The parent or guardian of a pupil shall be liable to the school for all property belonging to the school loaned to the pupil and not returned upon demand of an employee of the school authorized by the Director to make the demand."
