AN ACT TO ADD NEW SECTIONS 11503, 11504, AND 11505 TO THE GOVERNMENT CODE TO PROHIEIT UNAUTHORIZED ENTRY INTO CAMPUSES MAINTAINED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Intent. It is the intent of the Legislature not to deprive any person after school hours from the use of any public facilities within the public schools of Guam, if permitted by school authorities.

Section 2. New Sections 11503, 11504 and 11505 are added to the Government Code to read:

"Section 11503. Same: Unauthorized entry. person entering any campus maintained by the Department of Education shall immediately proceed to the administrative office of the school located on that campus and announce his purpose for being on campus to the principal of that school or designee. The principal or his designee may grant any person written authority to remain on campus for a specific period of time and for a specific purpose or the principal or his designee may order the person to immediately leave the campus. Any person found on a school campus without the written permission provided for in this section, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and is punishable by imprisonment not exceeding thirty (30) days or by a fine not exceeding Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) or both such fine and imprisonment; provided that this section shall not apply to the following:

(1) students enrolled at the particular school campus who are in good standing and not the subject of an order of suspension or expulsion;

- (2) teachers and staff of the particular school campus;
  - (3) peace officers; and

(4) such other persons as the Board by rule or regulation shall permit.

Section 11504. Same: same. Every person who at any time enters any school campus maintained by the Department of Education with the intent of entering into a fight with any person or causing disruption on said school campus is guilty of a misdemeanor and punishable by a fine of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300) or by imprisonment for not more than thirty (30) days or both.

Section 11505. The Board shall cause to be posted at the entrance or entrances of every school campus signs which set out in a conspicuous manner Sections 11503 and 11504 of this Code. The Board shall see to it that said signs shall continue to be maintained in a readable condition."

Within thirty (30) days of the passage of this Act, the Board shall cause to be posted at the entrance or entrances of every school campus signs which set out in a conspicuous manner Sections 11503 and 11504 of this Code. The Board shall see to it that said signs shall continue to be maintained in a readable condition.
