


CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR

AN ACT TO ADD NEW SECTIONS 11503, 11504,
AND 11505 TO THE GOVERNMENT CODE TO
PROHIBIT UNAUTHORIZED ENTRY INTO CAMPUSES
MAINTAINED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Legislative Intent. It is the intent of the
3 Legislature not to deprive any person after school hours from
4 the use of any public facilities within the public schools of
5 Guam, if permitted by school authorities.

6 Section 2. New Sections 11503, 11504 and 11505 are added
7 to the Government Code to read:

8 "Section 11503. Same: Unauthorized entry. Every
9 person entering any campus maintained by the Department of
10 Education shall immediately proceed to the administrative
11 office of the school located on that campus and announce
12 his purpose for being on campus to the principal of that
13 school or designee. The principal or his designee may
14 grant any person written authority to remain on campus for
15 a specific period of time and for a specific purpose or the
16 principal or his designee may order the person to immediately
17 leave the campus. Any person found on a school campus
18 without the written permission provided for in this section,
19 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and is punishable by
20 imprisonment not exceeding thirty (30) days or by a fine
21 not exceeding Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) or both such
22 fine and imprisonment; provided that this section shall not
23 apply to the following:

1 (1) students enrolled at the particular school
2 campus who are in good standing and not the subject
3 of an order of suspension or expulsion;

4 (2) teachers and staff of the particular school
5 campus;

6 (3) peace officers; and

7 (4) such other persons as the Board by rule or
8 regulation shall permit.

9 Section 11504. Same: same. Every person who at any
10 time enters any school campus maintained by the Department
11 of Education with the intent of entering into a fight with
12 any person or causing disruption on said school campus is
13 guilty of a misdemeanor and punishable by a fine of Three
14 Hundred Dollars (\$300) or by imprisonment for not more than
15 thirty (30) days or both.

16 Section 11505. The Board shall cause to be posted at
17 the entrance or entrances of every school campus signs
18 which set out in a conspicuous manner Sections 11503 and
19 11504 of this Code. The Board shall see to it that said
20 signs shall continue to be maintained in a readable condi-
21 tion."

22 Section 3. Within thirty (30) days of the passage of this
23 Act, the Board shall cause to be posted at the entrance or en-
24 trances of every school campus signs which set out in a conspicu-
25 ous manner Sections 11503 and 11504 of this Code. The Board
26 shall see to it that said signs shall continue to be maintained
27 in a readable condition.
