AN ACT REPEALING AND REENACTING CERTAIN SECTIONS OF THE GOVERNMENT AND CIVIL CODES RELATING TO THE REGISTRATION OF OPERATORS OF MOTOR VEHICLES, REGISTRATION OF MOTOR VEHICLES AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Subsections (e) and (j) of Section 23100 of the Government Code are repealed and reenacted to read:

- "(e) An applicant for a license or permit shall submit an application to the Department of Revenue and Taxation on a form prescribed by it, verified under oath and containing the following information:
 - (1) the applicant's full name, age, sex, and both mailing and residence addresses;
 - (2) the height, weight, and color of eyes of the applicant;
 - (3) the kind of license applied for;
 - (4) whether the applicant has been licensed previously as an operator or chauffeur, and if so, when and in what jurisdiction and whether or not any such license has been suspended or revoked, and if so, the date of and reason for such suspension or revocation;
 - (5) whether the applicant previously has been refused an operator's or chauffeur's license in Guam, and if so, the date and the reason for such refusal;

- (6) whether the applicant has previously operated a motor vehicle, and if so, for what length of time;
- (7) whether the applicant has the normal use of both hands and feet;
- (8) whether the applicant has ever been afflicted with heart condition, epilepsy, paralysis, insanity, or other disability or disease affecting his ability to exercise reasonable and ordinary control in operating a motor vehicle upon a highway;
- (9) whether the applicant understands traffic signs and signals;
- (10) one parent or guardian of an applicant under the age of eighteen (18) shall attest to his relationship with the minor; certify the correctness of information furnished on the application form; give his consent to the issuance of a license to the applicant and shall sign the application;
- (11) the applicant and licensing official shall sign all approved applications and date the application at the time signatures are made; and
- (12) any other information necessary to determine whether the applicant is entitled to a license under this Title.

An applicant for a chauffeur's license shall state the type of vehicle or combination of vehicles he desires to operate.

Every license and permit shall state whether it 1 is an operator's or chauffeur's license or instruction permit 2 and shall bear thereon the distinguishing number assigned 3 to the application, the dates of issue and expiration, the 4 name, date of birth, residence address, height, weight, 5 color of eyes, a photograph of the licensee (except that the 6 instruction permit shall not bear a photograph of the 7 licensee), and a space upon which the licensee shall write 8 his usual signature. No license shall be valid until "it 9 has been signed by the licensee. In the case of a chauf-10 feur's license, the license shall also state whether it is 11 a general or restricted license, and if restricted, the type 12 of vehicle or combination of vehicles the licensee is per-13 mitted to operate. Each license and permit shall also con-14 tain a space for common restrictive requirements such as 15 corrective lenses, hearing aid, hand control or pedal 16 extension, left foot accelerator, no night driving, or 17 other." 18 Section 2. Section 23325 of the Government Code is repealed 19

Section 2. Section 23325 of the Government Code is repealed and reenacted to read:

"Section 23325. Registration: Expiration. Every vehicle registration under this Title and every registration card issued shall be renewed annually. Upon payment of proper fees, the Department of Revenue and Taxation may renew the registration of vehicles.

A portion of all registered vehicles shall be required to be registered each calendar month and such registration shall expire at midnight on the last day of that month.

(a) The required date of registration for each owner of a vehicle is to be established by the Director of the Department of Revenue and Taxation in such a manner that a staggered renewal procedure is adopted for the territory.

- (b) The Director of the Department of Revenue and Taxation shall publicize by all media means available and especially newspaper, radio, television and government bulletin boards, the regulations setting forth procedures promulgated by him in accordance with the Administrative Adjudication Act to effect a staggered vehicle registration at least sixty (60) days prior to implementation of the new registration period.
- and Taxation, for the sole purpose of making a transition to the staggered renewal schedule, shall, notwithstanding other sections of this Code, develop a registration fee schedule which will permit a short term registration of less than twelve (12) months, followed by a registration of twelve (12) months duration or provide an option to pay a fee for a single registration in excess of twelve (12) months but not to exceed twenty-four (24) months."

Section 3. Section 23327 of the Government Code is repealed and reenacted to read:

"Section 23327. Registration. Renewal. An owner applying for renewal of vehicle registration shall make application to the Department of Revenue and Taxation during the month in which his registration expires by presenting

the registration card issued by the department for use at the time of renewal and by payment of the full annual fee for such vehicle as provided in this Title. The Department of Revenue and Taxation may, in addition, require a written application for renewal, verified under oath, setting forth information required pursuant to Section 23304 of this Code for a new vehicle registration and such additional information as may be required by the department." Section 4. Section 23329 of the Government Code is repealed and reenacted to read:

"Section 23329. License Plates: Renewal. (a) Every license plate and special plate issued under this Title expires at midnight on the last day of the month in which the registration expires each year. Upon application to the Department of Revenue and Taxation and payment of the fee provided in this Title, the person to whom any such plate was issued may obtain a new plate or device indicating registration for the coming year.

(b) Every application for the renewal of a license may be made during the month the registration expires but shall be made by midnight of the last day of the month in which the registration expires."

Section 5. Section 25 of the Civil Code is repealed and reenacted to read:

"Section 25. Minors, who are. Minors are persons under eighteen (18) years of age."

Section 6. A new Section 23100.6 is added to the Government Code to read:

"Section 23100.6. Instruction permits: alternative provision. The Director shall issue to any person who is

in his sixteenth (16th) year and has successfully completed the written driver's license examination a permit which shall be valid until such person reaches his sixteenth (16th) birthday so long as he is accompanied by a licensed parent or guardian while operating a motor vehicle."

Section 7. Section 3 of Public Law 14-5, as amended by Public Law 14-57, is further amended to read as follows:

"Section 3. The Board of Commissioners of Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Authority is directed to create a special fund for the Authority and to deposit it to the proceeds of sales it makes at the GHURA 500 project. The fund so created shall be reserved by the Authority to reimburse the General Fund of the government for the \$1.0 million appropriated by Section 2 of this Act not later than June 30, 1973."

Section 8. Section 4233, (a), (3), of the Government Code is amended to read:

"(3) 'Average annual salary' for any member of the
Legislature shall mean the average of the three (3) highest
annual salaries received by a member during his years of
credited service, whether, or not with the Legislature, or an
amount equivalent to the annual compensation paid the
Director of Administration at the time the Legislator applies
for benefits, whichever is greater."

Section 9. Section 15(2) of Public Law 12-60, Twelfth Guam Legislature, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(2). For the construction of a police and fire substation in Merizo, including the purchase of a fire vehicle and necessary firefighting equipment, not to exceed a total of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000)."

Section 10. Section 8975 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 8975. Creation of Office. There is within the Executive Branch of the government of Guam an Office of Veterans Affairs. The Veterans Affairs Officer who is a member of the classified service is the head of the Office of Veterans Affairs. This section shall be effective upon the establishment of the pay range by the Civil Service Commission."

Section 11. Section 11999.4 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 11999.4. Apprentice Program Administrator.

There is hereby established within the Department of Administration an Apprentice Program Administrator who shall be responsible in administering the apprenticeship program.

He shall advise and assist line management in the development, organization and administration of the apprenticeship program. He shall work closely with heads of shops in the preparation of training materials, planning of training schedules, assuring adequate instruction the shops and in coordinating the work experience and related training phases of the program. He shall have direct supervision of classroom instruction and shall be responsible for the maintenance of apprentice training standards, for maintenance and review of apprentice records, administration of apprentice advancements and graduation, and submission of

In addition, the Apprentice Program Administrator ī shall be responsible for promoting the general welfare of 2 apprentices. Section 13. Appropriation. There is hereby appropriated to the Public Utility Agency of Guam from any available funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) to permit the design and construction of six deep wells in the northern part of Guam, such project being identified as EDA Project No. 07-11-01855.

Section 14. Subject to provisions of Public Law 14-27, Section 4106 of Chapter II, Title V of the Covernment Code of Guam is hereby amended in part to read as follows:

> \$16,000" "Chief Commissioner

Section 15. The allocation of Two Hundred Sixty-Four Thousand Dollars (\$264,000) in the FY78 budget appropriation of Two Hundred Seventy-Mine Thousand Bollars (\$279,000) for contractual services in the Highway Division of the Department of Public Works for street lighting is authorized to be used to pay Guam Power Authority charges for village street lights as well as for street lights on primary, secondary and collector roads. This action is taken to curb the disconnection of village street lights while adequate sums remain available for the continuance of service.

Section 16. The sum of Six Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$600,000) is hereby appropriated from any available funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund for the purpose of upgrading and providing necessary improvement to the present water system serving the village of Santa Rita and its environ.

Section 17. The appropriation authorized under Section 16 of this Act is considered to be an initial appropriation for the purpose of implementing the recommendations for the upgrading and improvements to the Santa Rita-Agat Water System currently being prepared in conjunction with the islandwide Drinking Water Facilities Plan. Said implementation shall commence only after the completion of the engineering report to be prepared under the Territorial Water Facilities Plan.

Section 18. The appropriation made under Section 16 of this Act is hereby authorized to be used as local matching share to any available federal grant-in-aid program.

Section 19. The Public Utility Agency of Guam is hereby authorized to seek all available federal grant-in-aid programs to supplement the local appropriation authorized under this Act.
