




CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR



AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO LEGALIZE
THE OVEREXPENDITURES ON CERTAIN PROJECTS
AND TO CLEAR THE ACCOUNTS.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

1 Section 2. Part II, Section 4.A.1. and 2. of Public Law
2 14-43 is hereby amended to read:

3 "Section 4.A. There are hereby appropriated from any
4 available balance in the University of Guam Fund the
5 following sums consisting of Six Million Two Hundred Sixty-
6 Two Thousand Dollars (\$6,262,000) Contribution from the
7 General Fund, Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000)
8 transfer from the Land Grant Endowment Fund, One Million
9 One Hundred Seventy-Eight Thousand Nine Hundred Fourteen
10 Dollars (\$1,178,914) from Federal Grants-in-Aid, and Two
11 Hundred Forty-Nine Thousand Four Hundred Seventy-Nine Dollars
12 (\$249,479) from Fees and Tuition for the operation of the
13 University of Guam for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1978:

- 14 1. General Administration \$ 1,913,207
- 15 2. Colleges 5,118,825"

16 Section 3. The Territory's share from the Intergovernmental
17 Antirecession Assistance Act of 1977 (P. L. 95-30) is hereby
18 identified as the source of funding for the Two Hundred Seventy-
19 Eight Thousand Five Hundred Eighty Dollars (\$278,580) appropriated
20 under this Act for salary adjustments for the faculty and
21 administrators of the University of Guam as provided in Resolu-
22 tion 77-23 of the University of Guam Board of Regents.

23 Section 4. Section 9 of P. L. 13-116, the Medical Malprac-
24 tice Reform Act of 1975, is hereby amended to read as follows:

25 "Section 9. The provisions of Section 8 shall expire
26 June 30, 1978."

1 Section 5. A new item 3.a-f. is added to Part One, Section
2 1.X.B. of Public Law 14-43 to read as follows:

3 "3. Office of Overall Economic
4 Development Plan

15 Section 6. Items a and b of Part I, Section 1.I.H.1. of
16 Public Law 14-43 are hereby amended to read:

- 18 b. Personnel Benefits \$ 136,082"

19 Section 7. Section 4207.9 of the Government Code is amended
20 to read:

21 "Section 4207.9. Credit for education. Any bona fide
22 resident of Guam, who receives his graduate or under-
23 graduate degree from an accredited institution and is
24 employed by the government of Guam after obtaining such
25 degree, may claim retirement credit equal to the period of
26 time, including vacations, which a full-time student would
27 normally take to complete the program leading to the
28 degree he received, or any lesser period he may elect to

claim, by paying to the Fund the appropriate member's and employer's shares based on the period of credit sought to be obtained and his salary when he begins employment with the government of Guam; provided, however, that this section shall apply only to those persons:

(a) who received their degrees after June 1, 1945;

(b) who were bona fide residents of Guam at the time they began their undergraduate studies; and

(c) who had been employed by the government for at least ten (10) years as full-time, locally hired employees."

Section 8. There is hereby appropriated from any available balance of the General Fund the sum of Seventy-Six Thousand One Hundred Dollars (\$76,100) for the purpose of completing architectural and engineering plans for the Phase II construction of the Nieves M. Flores Library.

Section 9. Any expenditures under Section 8 of this Act are authorized to be charged against the Nine Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$900,000) in Guam Rehabilitation Funds, as identified in Resolution No. 74 of the Fourteenth Guam Legislature now pending approval by the U. S. Congress for reprogramming for the purpose of completing the Phase II construction of the Library provided, however, that the appropriation made by Section 8 of this Act shall immediately revert to the General Fund at the time the reprogramming is approved.
