 - (1) upon the termination by the licensee of his position with the Attorney General, the Public Defender Service Corporation or the Office of the United States Attorney, as the case may be;
 - (2) sixteen renths after the licensoo's temporary admission to practice in the territory:

or

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(3) upon certification of the licensee's failure to pass two bar examinations given by the Beard of Bar Exeminers.

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(c) For thirty days after this Act takes effect, any person employed on February 6, 1978 by the Office of the Attorney General, the Public Defender Service Corporation or the Office of the United States Attorney for the district of Guam may continue to practice in this territory without complying with the provisions of this Section if such person qualified under Section 28002.2 of the Government Code to practice law in this territory."
