AN ACT TO AMEND PUBLIC LAW 14-43 FOR THE  
PURPOSE OF SUPPLEMENTING THE OPERATIONAL  
BUDGET OF THE BUREAU OF PLANNING FOR FISCAL  
YEAR 1978.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. The appropriations made in Part I, Section 1,  
3 Subsections I., D., a., b., d., e., f. of P. L. 14-43, as amended,  
4 are hereby amended to read:

5 "I. For General Government Operations

6 D. Bureau of Planning

7 a. Personal Services	\$437,409
8 b. Personnel Benefits	45,664
9 d. Contractual Services	102,601
10 e. Supplies and Materials	5,525
11 f. Miscellaneous Items:	
12 1. Advertisement	1,600."

13 Section 2. The appropriation for Power, Water/Sewer and  
14 Telephone made in Part I, Section 1, Subsection XII, 7, is hereby  
15 amended to read:

16 "XII. For Power, Water/Sewer and Telephone

17 7. Bureau of Planning

18 a. Telephone

5,328."

1 Section 3. The following Federal Grants-in-Aid sums listed

11 Section 4. A new Item f. is added to Part One, Section 1,  
 12 VIII.A.3., to read:

"A. Department of Parks and Recreation		
3. Recreation Division		
Miscellaneous Items:		
For Updating the Guam		
Comprehensive Outdoor		
Recreation Plan		\$11,718."

19 Section 5. A new Subsection S. is added to Part One,  
 20 Section 1.XIV. of Public Law 14-43 to read:

"S. Department of Parks and Recreation		
Federal Bureau of Outdoor Recreation		
1. Land and Water Conservation		
Fund	15.400	\$11,718."

25 Section 6. The supplemental appropriation provided in  
 26 Section 1 of this Act, with regards to personal services, shall  
 27 be used solely for the limited-term employment of personnel  
 28 necessary to carry out the conditions of the Coastal Zone Manage-  
 29 ment Grant-in-Aid; such limited-term appointment to coincide with

1 the term of available federal assistance. Notwithstanding other  
2 provisions of law, the Bureau of Planning is authorized to expend  
3 all federal grants and local matching funds appropriated for  
4 fiscal year 1978 beyond June 30, 1978 for the full term of the  
5 grants awarded.

6 Section 7. (a) Section 4 of Public Law 14-100 is repealed  
7 and reenacted to read:

8 "Section 4. The first paragraph and Subsection a. of  
9 Section 3 of Public Law 14-33 are repealed and reenacted  
10 to read:

11 'Section 3. There is hereby appropriated from  
12 any available balance of the Territorial Highway Fund  
13 the sum of Five Million Twelve Thousand Five Hundred  
14 Thirty-Seven Dollars (\$5,012,537) including Three  
15 Million Four Hundred Two Thousand Six Hundred Seventy-  
16 Seven Dollars (\$3,402,677) in FHWA funds for the  
17 following projects:

18 a. Route 14 reconstruction from  
19 Route 1 to Guam Memorial  
20 Hospital \$1,725,000.' "

21 (b) Subsection d of Section 3 of Public Law 14-33 is  
22 amended to read:

23 "d. Construct Route 1 from Hospital  
24 Road to Camp Watkins Road \$ 900,000."

25 Section 8. There is hereby appropriated from the General  
26 Fund the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) for travel expenses  
27 of the Governor, Speaker and President of the Constitutional Con-  
28 vention to present the proposed Constitution and to deliver to

1 the President of the United States a request from the people of  
2 Guam on the question of the reinstatement of the \$40 Million Dol-  
3 lars for the relocation of the Ammunition Wharf and for other  
4 purposes pertaining to the growth of Guam to the proper authorities  
5 in Washington, D. C.; provided that the Constitution shall be  
6 transmitted no later than April 30, 1978.

7 Section 9. There is hereby reappropriated from the available  
8 balance of Section 8, Part Three of Public Law 12-60 the following  
9 amounts:

10 1. The sum of Thirty-Three Thousand Dollars (\$33,000)  
11 for the installation of a six inch waterline and fire  
12 hydrants on Santa Cruz Lane in Anigua, Municipality of  
13 Agana.

14 2. The sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) for the  
15 Off-Island Sports Travel Fund being administered by the  
16 Department of Parks and Recreation.

17 Section 10. Subsections (e) and (f) of Section 28019 of the  
18 Government Code are repealed and reenacted to read:

19 "(e) that he has completed at least two (2) years of  
20 college;

21 (f) that he has graduated from a law school in the  
22 United States, its territories or possessions accredited  
23 by the American Bar Association; and".

24 Section 11. A new Section 28019.1 is added to the Government  
25 Code to read:

26 "Section 28019.1. Special Provisions for Government  
27 Attorneys. Upon recommendation of the Attorney General (or  
28 as to such Attorney General upon recommendation of the Board

1 of Bar Examiners), any person employed by the Office of  
2 Attorney General, the Public Defender Service Corporation,  
3 or the Office of United States Attorney for the District  
4 of Guam may, in the discretion of the Board of Bar Examiners,  
5 upon application and hearing as hereinafter specified, be  
6 temporarily admitted to practice in this territory without  
7 a written examination if the applicant meets the qualifica-  
8 tions fixed by Subsections (b) through (f) of Section 28019  
9 of this Code and, in addition meets the following require-  
10 ments:

11 (a) Admitted to practice in the highest court of  
12 state or territory of the United States upon written  
13 examination under standards of admission which were  
14 substantially equivalent to then standards for  
15 admission in Guam.

16 (b) Upon investigation and hearing by the Board  
17 of Bar Examiners, must satisfy the Board that the  
18 applicant is professionally, morally and ethically  
19 qualified for admission to the Bar of Guam and admission  
20 of such applicant would be in the best interest of the  
21 citizens and Bar of Guam. In every such case, the  
22 burden shall be upon the applicant to establish his  
23 qualification for admission on motion. A license  
24 issued pursuant to this section, shall terminate:

25 (1) upon the termination by the licensee of  
26 his position with the Attorney General, the Public  
27 Defender Service Corporation or the Office of the  
28 United States Attorney, as the case may be;

29 (2) sixteen months after the licensee's  
30 temporary admission to practice in the territory;  
31 or

1 (3) upon certification of the licensee's  
2 failure to pass two bar examinations given by the  
3 Board of Bar Examiners.

4 (c) For thirty days after this Act takes effect,  
5 any person employed on February 6, 1978 by the Office of  
6 the Attorney General, the Public Defender Service  
7 Corporation or the Office of the United States Attorney  
8 for the district of Guam may continue to practice in  
9 this territory without complying with the provisions  
10 of this Section if such person qualified under Section  
11 28002.2 of the Government Code to practice law in this  
12 territory."

13 Section 12. Sections 10 and 11 of this Act shall become  
14 effective contemporaneously with the effectiveness of Substitute  
15 Bill 74, Fourteenth Guam Legislature, if such bill shall become  
16 law notwithstanding the Governor's veto.
