AM ACT TO AMEND SECTION 4106; TO ADD SECTION 5120; TO ADD A NEW CHAPTER V TO TITLE XXVII, ALL TO THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, RELATIVE TO THE CREATION OF A DEPARTMENT OF YOUTH AFFAIRS, EMFINING ITS FUNCTIONS, PROGRAMS, AND STAFFING; TO REPEAL THE FIRST PARAGRAPH OF SECTION 261, SUBSECTION 261(b) AND TO RENUMBER SUBSECTIONS 261(c), 261(d) AND 261(e) AS SUBSECTIONS 261(a), 261(b) AND 261(c); TO AMEND SUBSECTIONS 263(b) AND 263(c) AND SECTION 254, ALL OF THE CODE OF CIVIL PROCEDURE; AND TO REPEAL AND RESNACT SECTION 55014 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF CUAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 4106 of the Government Code is amended by adding a new item to read as follows:

"Director of the Department of Youth Affairs, not more than \$27,300.00."

Section 2. A new Section 5120 is hereby added to the Government Code to read:

"Section 5120. Department of Youth Affairs. There is within the executive branch of the government of Guam a Department of Youth Affairs. The head of the department

shall be the Director who shall be appointed by the Council 1 on Youth Affairs with the approval of the Covernor and with 2 the advice and consent of the Legislature." 3 Section 3. There is hereby added a new Chapter V to Title 4 XXVII of the Government Code to read: 5 "CHAPTER V Department of Youth Affairs 7 Section 26500. Citation. This Chapter may be cited as 'The Youth Affairs Act of 1978'. 9 Section 26501. Definitions. (a) 'Department' means 10 the Department of Youth Affairs as established by Section 11 5120 of the Government Code. 12 (b) 'Director' means the head of the Department of 13 Youth Affairs. 14 (c) 'Council' means the Guam Council on Youth Affairs. 15 'Youth' means any person twenty-five (25) years 16 of age and under. 17 (e) 'Committee' means the Special Services Committee. 18 Section 26502. Purpose. The purpose of the Department 19 is to plan, coordinate, and/or implement programs, services 20 and activities geared toward youth development, rehabilita-21 tion and involvement in the community. It shall not duplicate 22 existing programs of other agencies of the government of 23 Guam. 24 Section 20503. Duties and responsibilities. The 25 Department shall: 26 (a) formulate plans and policies, develop a 27 comprehensive approach, coordinate and/or implement 25 programs and services to enable the youth to develop 29 his full potential and skills, talent, leadership 30 ability, good sportsmanship and citizenship; 31 - 2 -

(b) provide youth services and program, to all districts of Guart Ž (c) encourage, through direct or indirect means. Ĵ all youths, especially those in need of guidance and 4 motivation, to make use of existing youth facilities, services and programs; (a) establish a comprehensive approach to pro-7 viding services and programs to youth, taking into con-8 sideration the coordination and consolidation of exist-Ģ ing programs and services, and planning and implementing 10 new programs and services where deemed necessary; 11 (e) make such referrals as are necessary when 12 certain services are best provided by other agencies 13 within the government of Guam or by other resources 14 within the community or abroad; 15 (f) provide assistance and cooperation to youth 16 and community groups, both organized and unorganized, 17 which provide or sponsor programs and/or services 18 beneficial to the youth; 19 (g) collect and disseminate information and 20 research data relative to youth needs and problems; 21 (h) keep the Governor, the Judges of the Courts 22 of Guam, the Guam Legislature, the District Commis-23 sioners and the general public informed on all major 24 youth developments and achievements; and 25 (i) have general purview of youth activities with-26 in the territory of Guam. 27 Section 26504. Guam Council on Youth Affairs. 28 is within the department a Guam Council on Youth Affairs. 29 - 3 -

The Council shall consist of eleven (11) Lembers appointed
by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Legisla-
ture for a term of four (4) years; provided that of the
members first appointed, three (3) shall serve for a term
of one (1) year, three (3) for a term of two (2) years,
three (3) for a term of three (3) years, and two (2) for
a term of four (4) years. The members shall determine by
lot which of them shall serve which terms. Vacancies shall
be filled the same as first appointments, but only for the
unexpired term of the vacant position. The members shall
be so selected that there be one (1) representative from
each of the following entities:

- (a) Judiciary Branch
- (b) Department of Fublic Safety
- (c) Department of Public Health and Social Services
  - (d) District Government Council
  - (e) Department of Labor
  - (f) University of Guam (youth student)
  - (g) Public School System (youth student)
  - (h) Private School System (youth student)
- (i) Southern Region (Yona, Talofofo, Inarajan, Merizo, Umatac, Agat, Santa Rita)
  - (j) Northern Region (Tamuning-Tumon, Bededo, Yige)
- (k) Central Region (Agana, Agana Heights, Asan-Maina, Mongmong-Toto-Maite, Barrigada, Mangilao, Chalun Pago-Ordot, Sinajana, Piti).

The Council shall elect from among its members a Chair-1 man and a Vice Chairman. Six (6) members shall constitute Ž a quorum. The affirmative votes of six (6) members shall ڏ, be necessary for Council action. Members of the Council 4 shall serve without compensation, but may be reimbursed for 5 reasonable travel and out-of-pocket expenses incurred in the performance of official duties, such expenses to be certifical 7 to the Tressurer of Guam by the Director. 8 Section 26305. Council powers. The Council shall be 9 responsible for the approval of plans and programs of the 10 Department of Youth Affairs and for that purpose shall 11 have the following powers, duties and responsibilities: 12 (a) Oversee the formulation of the department's 13 policies, plans and programs, and budget; 1.4 Be responsible for the over-all operation of 15

(c) Furnish leadership needed for long-range planning;

- (d) Accept on behalf of, and in the name of the government of Guam, from any government or agency thereof, or any person, natural or legal, advisory services, donations and gifts, provided, however, that any grantin-aid or other form of assistance involving an obligation on the part of the Council or the government of Guam shall require the prior approval of the Governor and a determination by the department's certifying officer of the availability of funds; and
- (e) Adopt such rules and regulations as may be necessary to implement the provisions of this Chapter.

Section 20500. Council swettings. The Council shall

or resolution, but it shall not be less than once per

nonth. All its meetings shall be public and notice of such

Section 26507. Chief Administrative Officer. The

Director shall be the chief administrative officer of the

Section 26507. Chief Administrative Officer. The Director shall be the chief administrative officer of the Department and the executive secretary of the Council. He shall be responsible for the day-to-day management and operation of the department.

Section 26503. Appropriations and expenditures. All requests or proposals for appropriations from the public funds of Guam and from the Federal government for the general operation and programs of the department shall be prepared by the Director, subject to the approval of the Council, prior to submission to the Governor and the Legislature.

Section 26509. Personnel. The Council is authorized to appoint such personnel and fix their duties and salaries, in accordance with Title V, Government Code, as may be necessary for purposes of this Chapter.

Section 26510. Federal grants. The birector shall comply with all Federal requirements pertaining to methods and standards of administration and with the approval of the Council, shall make such rules and regulations and follow such procedures as may be required for the receipt from the Federal government of grants or grants-in-aid for public assistance and such administrative costs as are provided in connection therewith.

Bourios 20311. Department Abailiary Services Fune.

- (a) For the purpose of securing, insofer as possible, self-supporting activities of some programs of the department, there is hereby established a fund to be known as the 'bapartment Auxiliary Service Fund' which shall be maintained in connection therewith.
- (b) All morios received by the department from its auxiliary services shall be deposited in said hepartment Auxiliary Service Fund. All debts, liabilities and obligations of any such services shall be paid from said fund. The Director of the department shall render to the Council a monthly statement reflecting the correct financial condition of said fund.

Section 26512. Voluntary services. The Council is authorized to solicit and accept services of individuals and organizations on a voluntary basis in its programs under a carefully planned and supervised manner.

Section 26513. Annual report. The Council on Youth Affairs shall make an annual report to the Governor at the termination of each fiscal year setting forth a summation of its activities and general recommendations.

Section 26514. Notwithstanding any provisions of law to the contrary, the department shall, as it deems necessary, augment, establish and maintain such programs and services for youth as provided in Sections 26503, 26515 and 26516 of this Act: provided that it shall not duplicate existing programs of other agencies of the government of Guam.

Section 2:515. Invision of Youth Development. There 1 shall be a Division of Youth Povelopment within the depart-2 mont. The division shall have the following duties and responsibilities: 4 (a) It shall be its major responsibility to S make first contact with youth in various districts, including predelinquent and delinquent, and provide 7 such services as deemed necessary, including outreach, ઠે in-take processing, referral, judicial and police 0 liaison, counseling and guidance. youths referred by the reportment of Tublic Safety, courts of Guars, parents or legal guardians, public and private agencies. Turthermore, it shall be responsible for care, custody and the rehabilitation of youth adjudicated by the courts of Guars.

- prising five (5) numbers, one (1) of whom shall be a youth, appointed by the Council and approved by the Governor. The members shall serve for four (4) years. Vacancies shall be filled the same as the initial appointments but only for the unexpired term. rems. The members shall serve without compensation because be reinbursed for reasonable travel and out-of-pecket expenses incurred in the performance of official duties as certified to the Treasurer of Guam by the Director.

The Special Services Committee shall exist for the sole purpose of providing input to the Supervisory Board of Guam's State Planning Agency for Criminal Justice and Law Enforcement (Territorial Crime Commission) relative to the development of the Supervisory Board's annual Comprehensive State Plan.

The Special Services Committee shall make recommendations and propose legislation for the de-institutionalization of 'status offenders' as required by the Juvenile Justice Delinquency Prevention Act of 1974.

The affirmative vote of six (6) members shall be necessary for the validity of any acts of the Special Services Committee.

Section 26517. Severability. If any provisions of this Chapter or the application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Chapter which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or applications and to this end the provisions of this Chapter are severable."

Section 4. The first paragraph of Section 261 (including Subsection 261(a)) and 261(b) of the Code of Civil Procedure are repealed; Subsections 261(c), (d), and (e) are renumbered 261(d), (b), and (c) respectively; and a new Section 26520 is added to the Government Code to read:

"Section 20039. Youth correctional facilities. The 1 Topartment of Youth Affairs within the executive branch ż shall maintain and operate facilities for the temporary or 3 continuing care, custody or detention, or commitment and 4 rehabilitation of youth, and may arrange for use of private 5 homes for such care or detention. Ó Direct supervision by the Department of Youth 7 Affairs. Wards of such correctional facilities shall be 8 under the direct supervision of the Department of Youth 9 Affairs in order to apply more advantageously the salutary 10 effect of home and family environment upon them, and also 11 in order to secure a better classification and segregation 12 of such wards according to their capacities, interests, 13 and reponsiveness to control and responsibilities, and to 14 give better opportunity for reform and encouragement of 15 self-discipline in such correctional facilities. 10 (b) Rules. The Department of Youth Affairs shall 17 promulgate, pursuant to the Administrative Adjudication Law, 18 such rules as may be necessary for the guidance of all youth 19 correctional or detention facilities, which rules shall be 20 filed with the Legislative Secretary." 21 Section 5. Section 254 and Subsections 263(b) and 263(e) 22 of the Code of Civil Procedure are amended to read: 23 "Section 254. Jurisdiction: Continuing. When jurisdic-24 tion shall have been obtained by the court in the case of 25 any child, such jurisdiction shall be retained by the court 26 for the purpose of this Title until such child becomes 27 eighteen (18) years of age, unless he is discharged prior 26 thereto by the court, or unless he is committed to and 29 received by the Department of Youth Affairs or a public 50 institution or agency maintained by the government of Guara; 31 - 11 -

provided, that the court may retain jurisdiction over a child placed by the court with such public institution or agency for temperary observation and care. Any decree or order of the court may be modified at any time, except as otherwise provided by law.

to the guardianship of a public or private institution or agency authorized to care for children or of the Department of Youth Affairs or to place them in family homes, or under the guardianship of a suitable person. Such commitment shall be for an indeterminate period, but in no event shall continue beyond the child's twenty-first (21st) birthday. In committing a child to a private institution or agency, the court shall select one that is approved by the Governor of Guam.

Subsection 263(e). The court may dismiss the petition or otherwise terminate its jurisdiction at any time.

No adjudication by the court of the status of any child shall be deemed a conviction, nor shall such adjudication operate to impose any of the civil disabilities ordinarily resulting from conviction, nor shall any child be found guilty or be deemed a criminal by reason of such adjudication, nor shall any child be charged with crime or convicted in any court except as provided in Section 255 of this Title. The disposition made of a child, or any evidence given in the court, shall not operate to disqualify the child in any civil service or military application or appointment.

Whenever the court shall commit a child to any institution or agency or the Department of Youth Affairs, it shall transmit with the order of commitment a summary of its

"Section 55014. Youth Facilities. Whenever the Juvenile Court is referred to by law, contract, Executive Order, rule or regulation or document concerning juvenile detention or rehabilitation, such references shall be deemed to mean the Department of Youth Affairs. All references to the Juvenile Court Judge or the Administrative Director of the Juvenile Justice Systems in law, contract, rule or regulation, Executive Order, or document concerning juvenile detention or rehabilitation shall be deemed to mean the Director of the Department of Youth Affairs. On the effective date of this Act, all contracts, books, records, papers, maps, plans, documents, facilities and pending business heretofore made, used and acquired or conducted by the Juvenile Court in juvenile detention or rehabilitation, shall be transferred to the Department of Youth Affairs. On the effective date of this Act, all officers and employees of the Juvenile Justice System engaged in juvenile detention or rehabilitation shall be transferred to the Department of Youth Affairs. All unexpended appropriations heretofore made for the operation of the Juvenile Justice System for juvenile detention and rehabilitation shall be transferred to the bepartment of Youth Affairs on the effective date of this Act."

Section 8. Effective Date. This Act shall take effect upon its enactment into law, but in order that there be no interruption of the administrative business of the government, the Governor may postpone the actual transfer of all or a portion of said such functions to be transferred by this Chapter until such time as the organization provided for can be put in full force and effect, but not later than six (6) months from the enactment of this Act. Except as otherwise provided herein, all officers, their subordinates and employees whose functions are covered in this Act shall continue to perform their duties from the date this Act takes effect.
